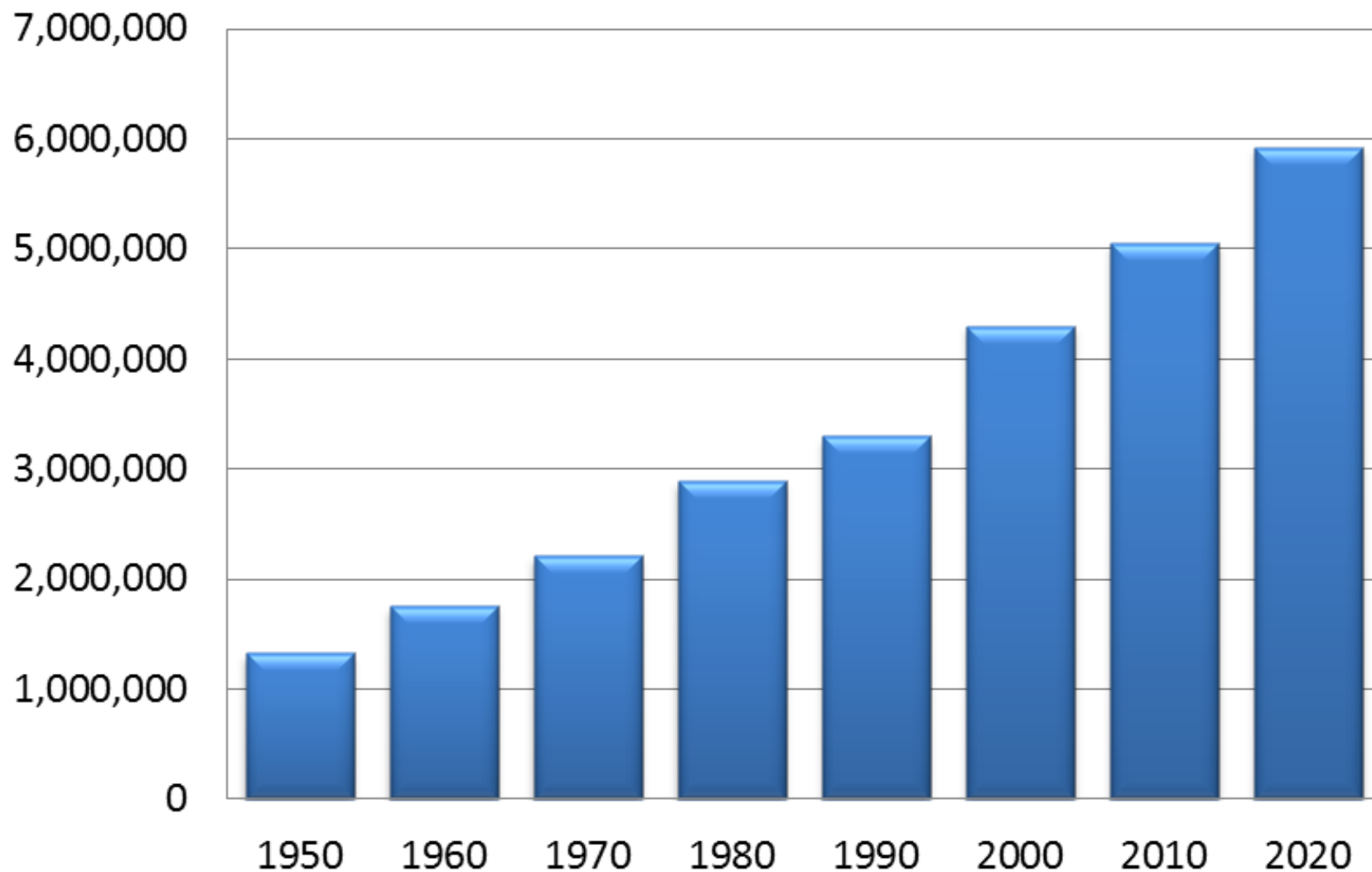

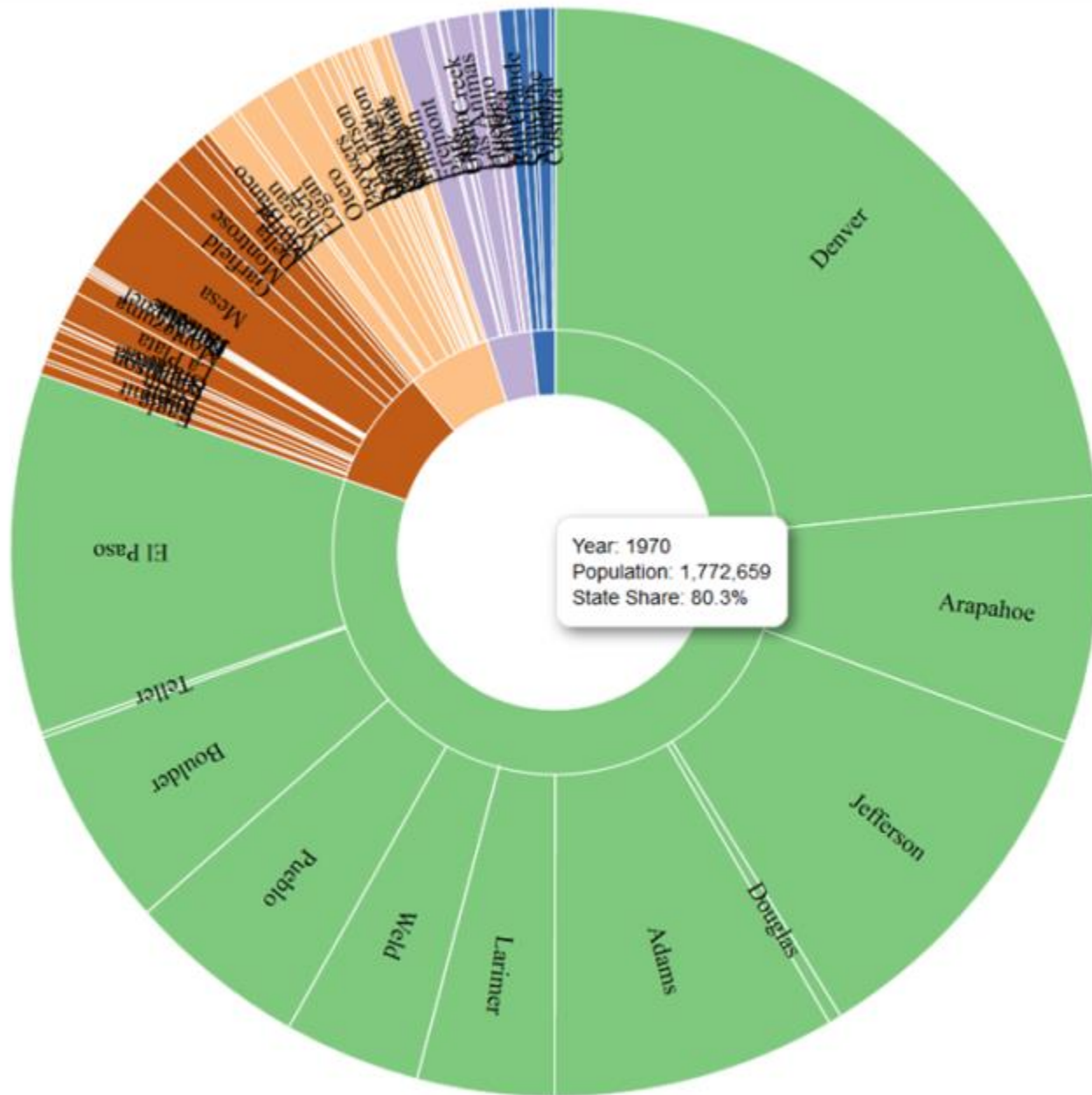

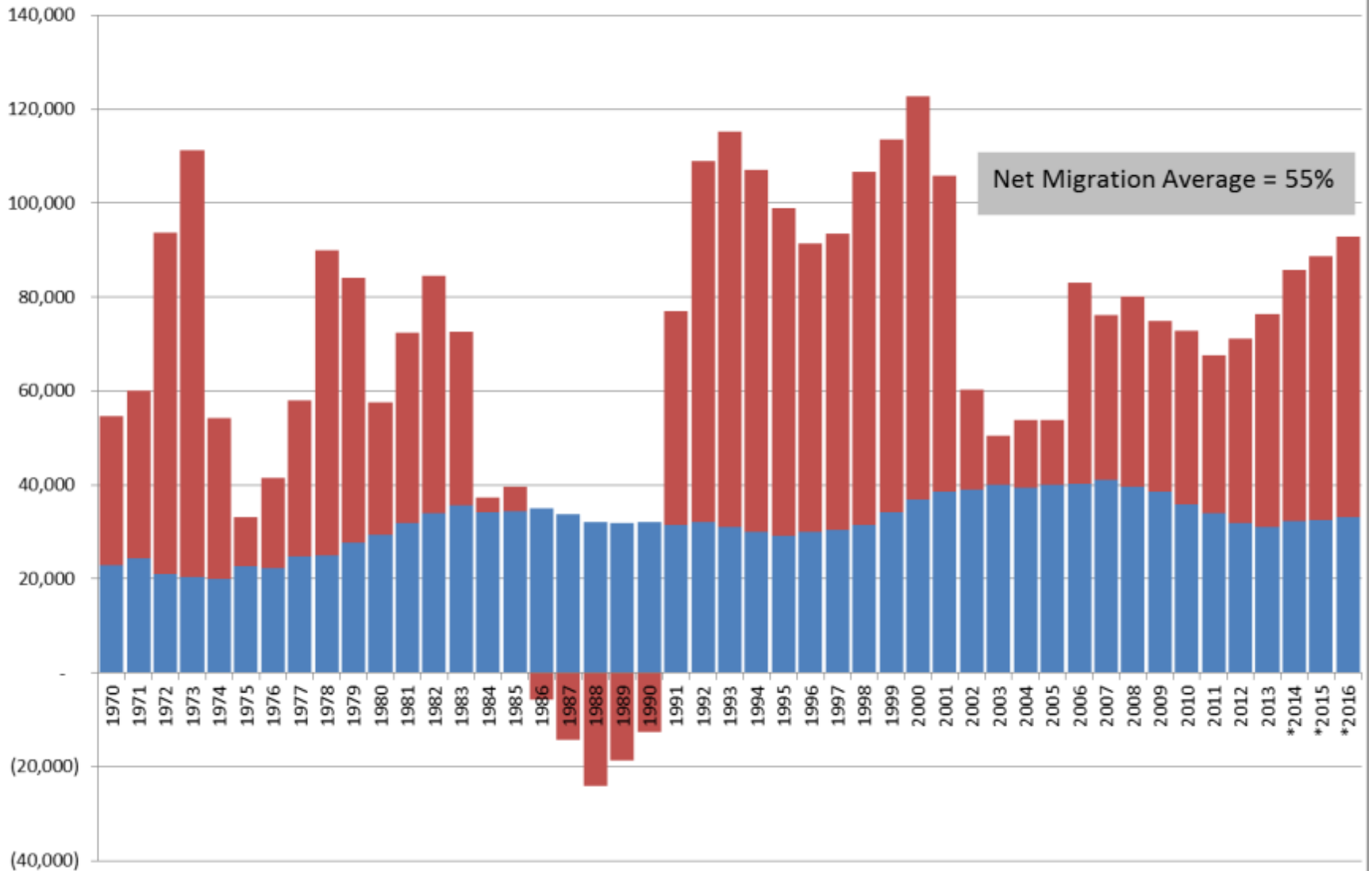

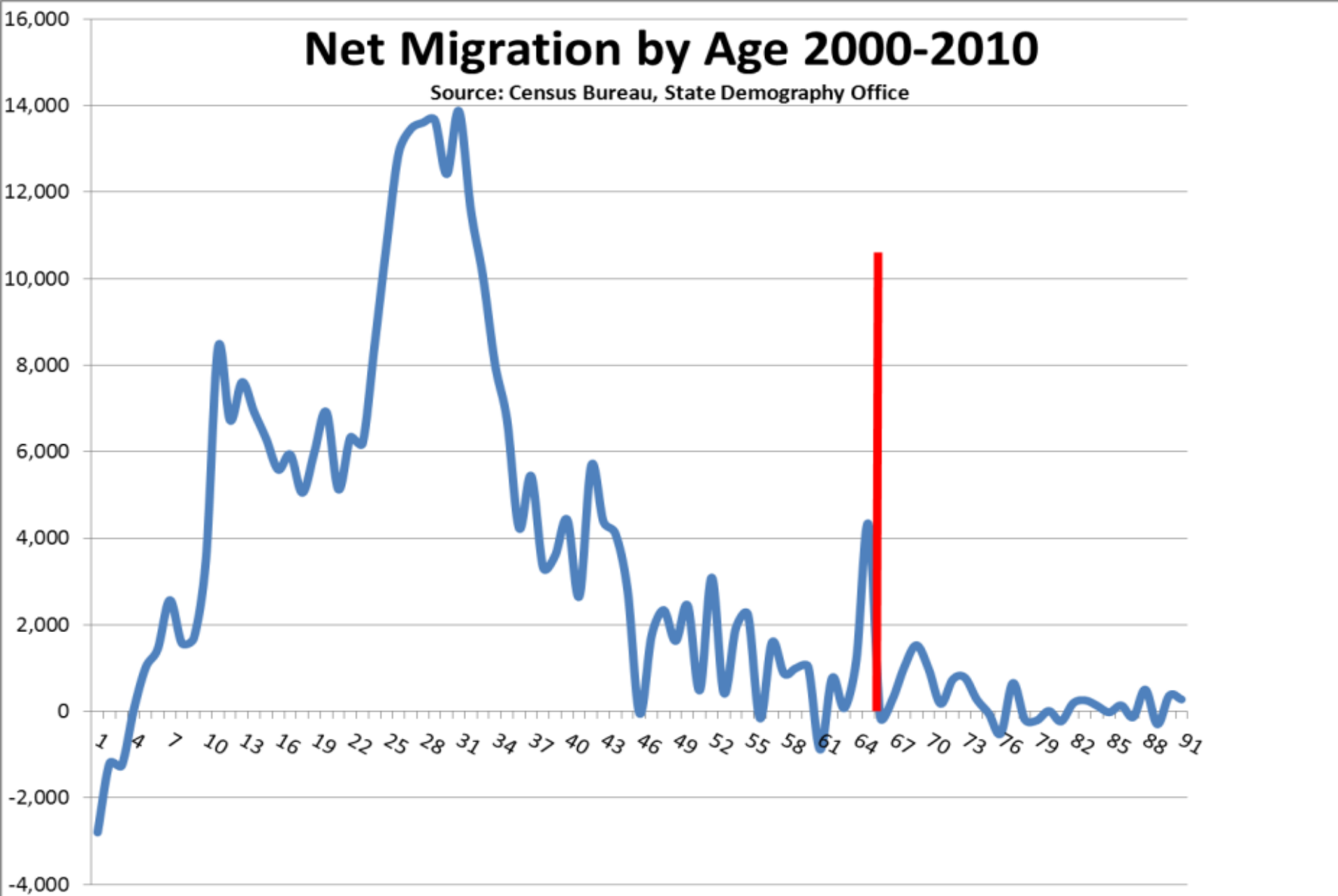
Migration and Natural Increase

■ Natural Increase ■ Net Migration

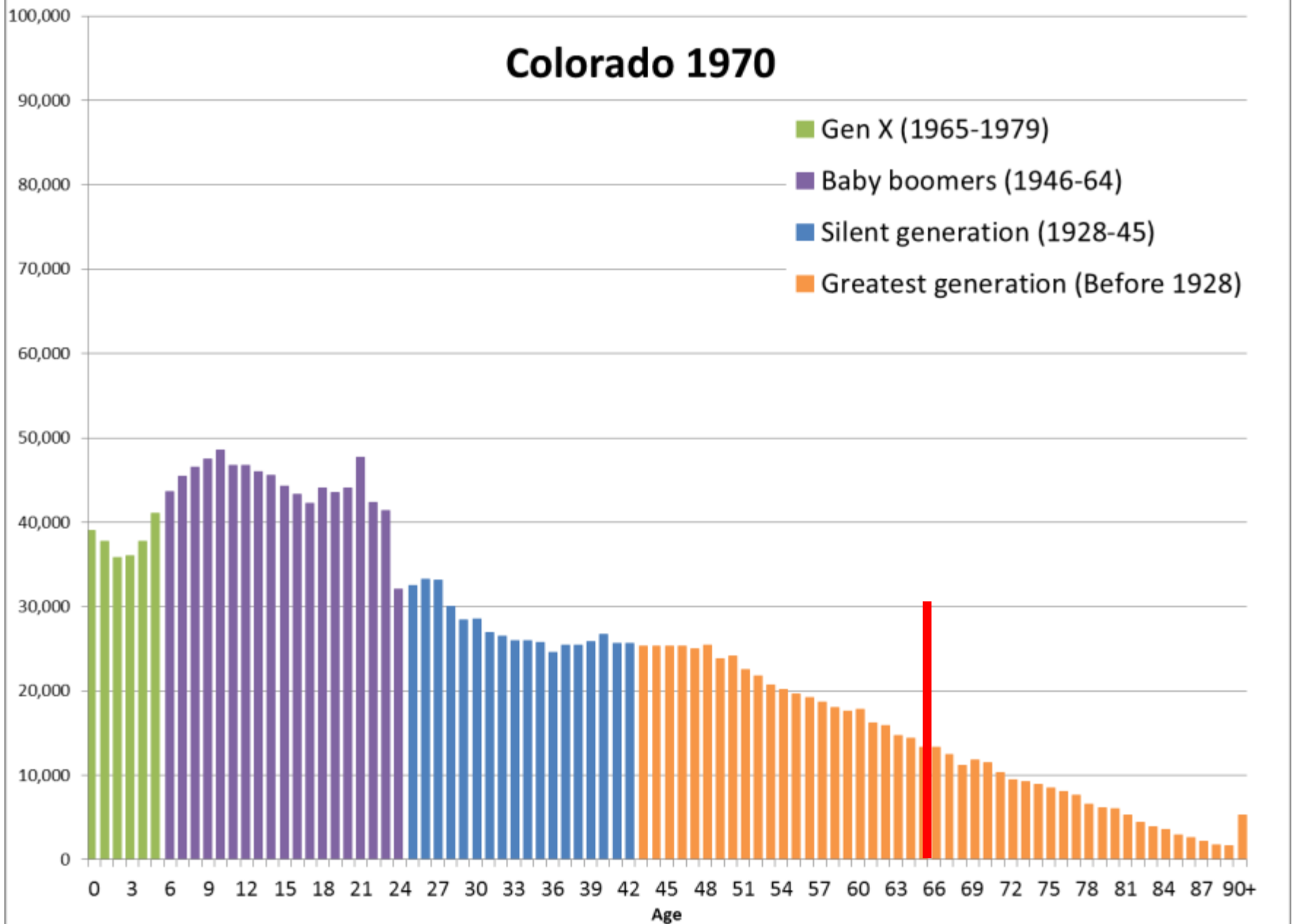


Net Migration by Age 2000-2010

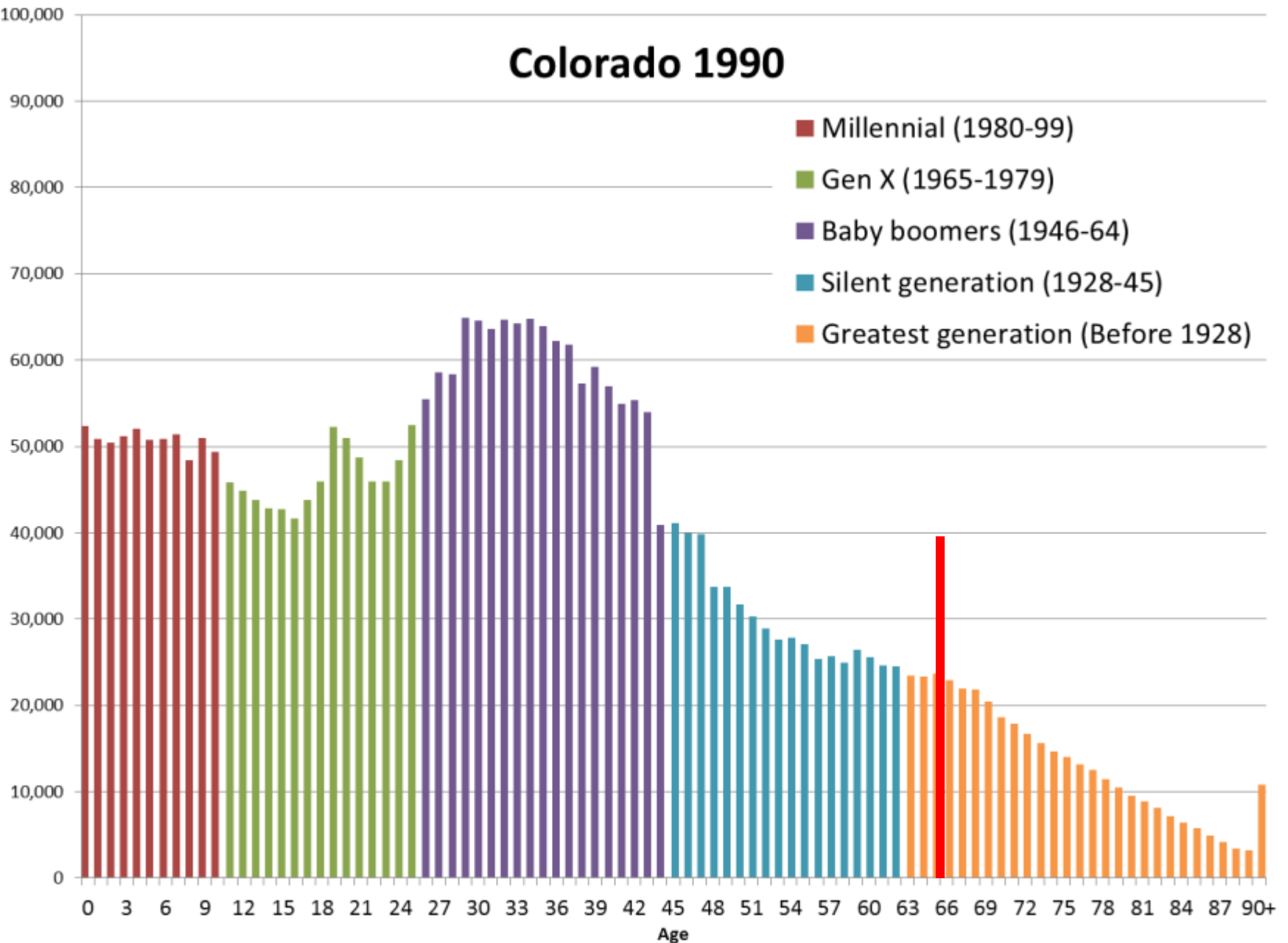

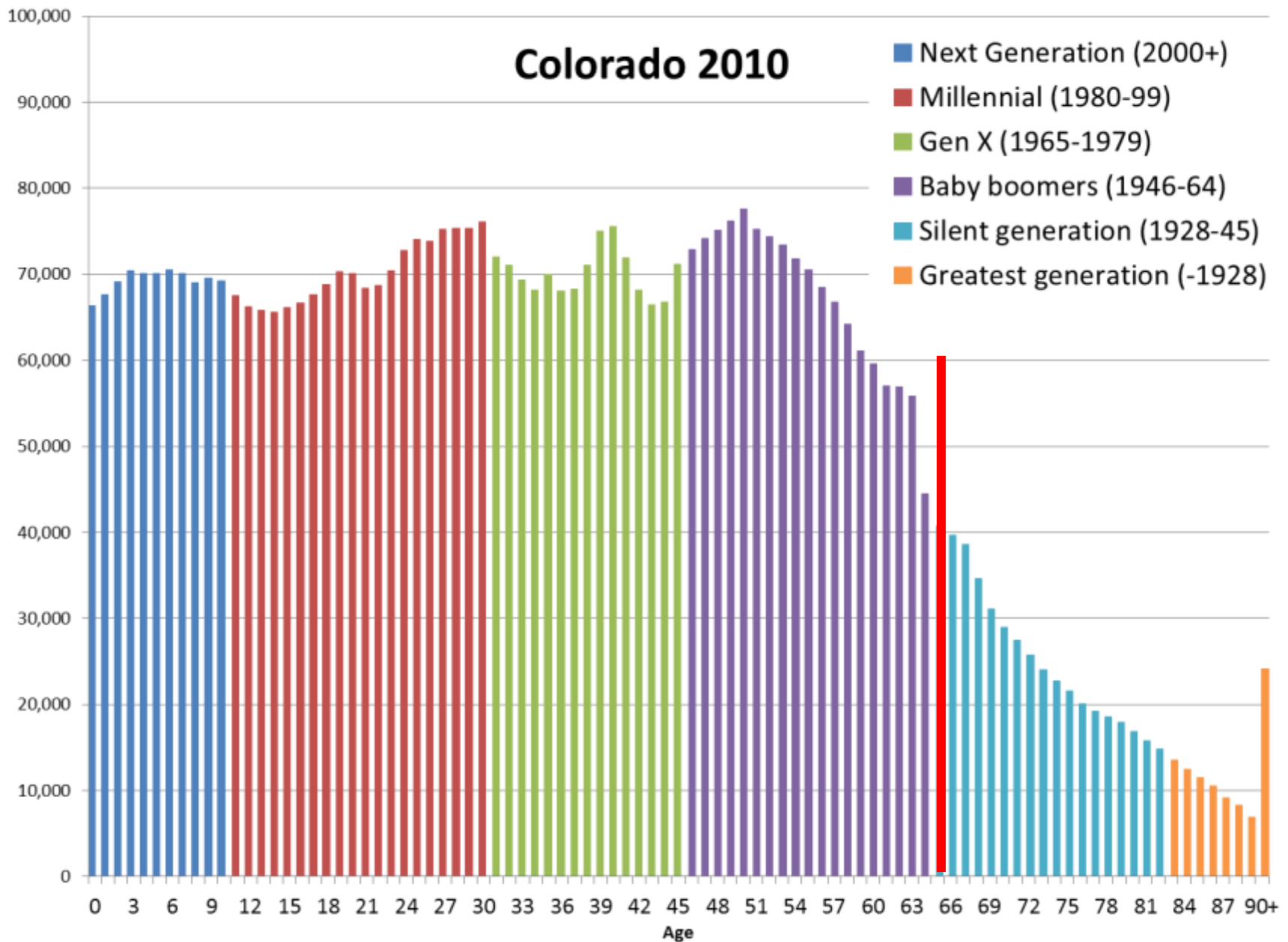

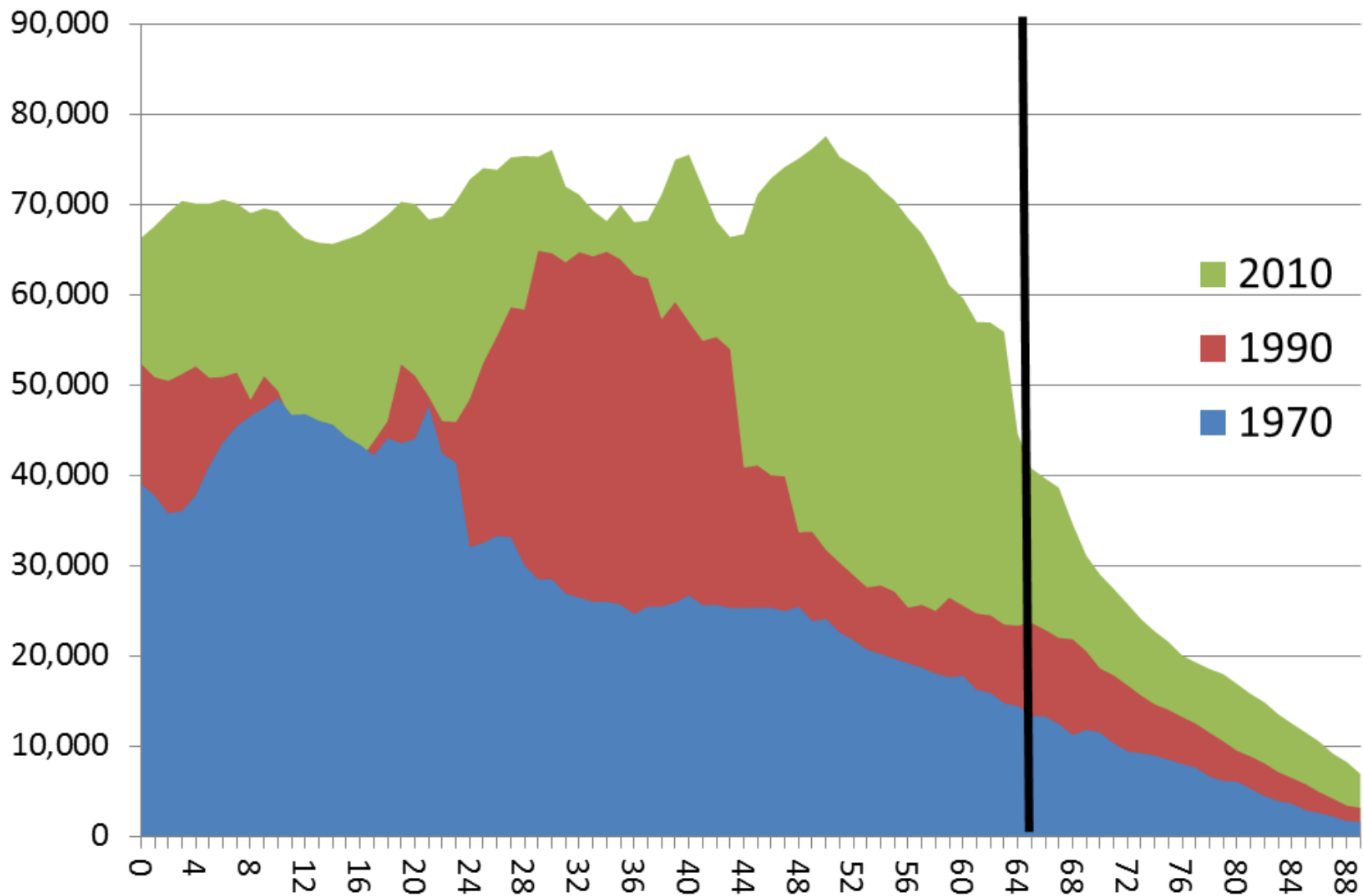

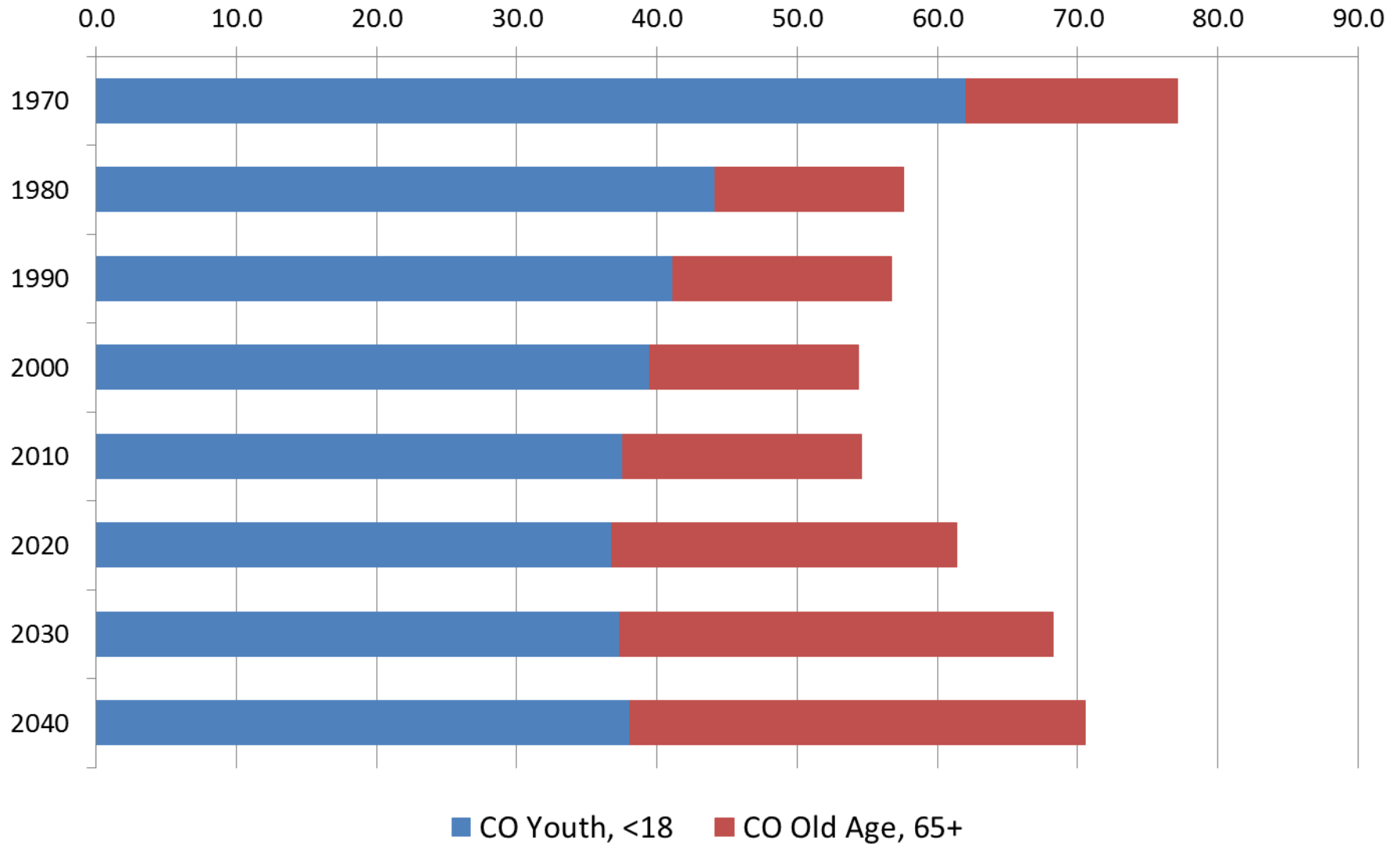


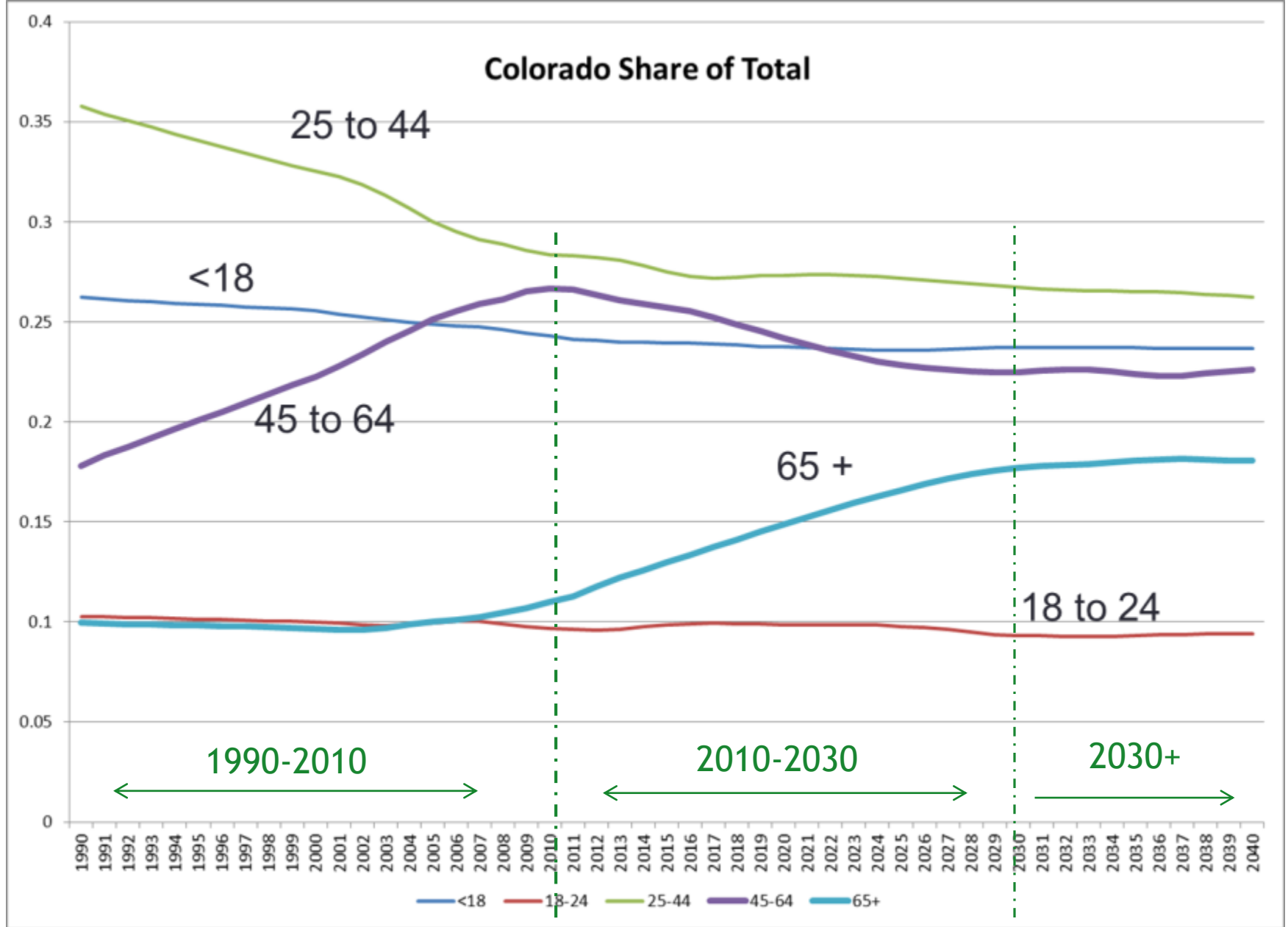
Colorado Population by Age 1970-2010



Colorado Dependency Ratio

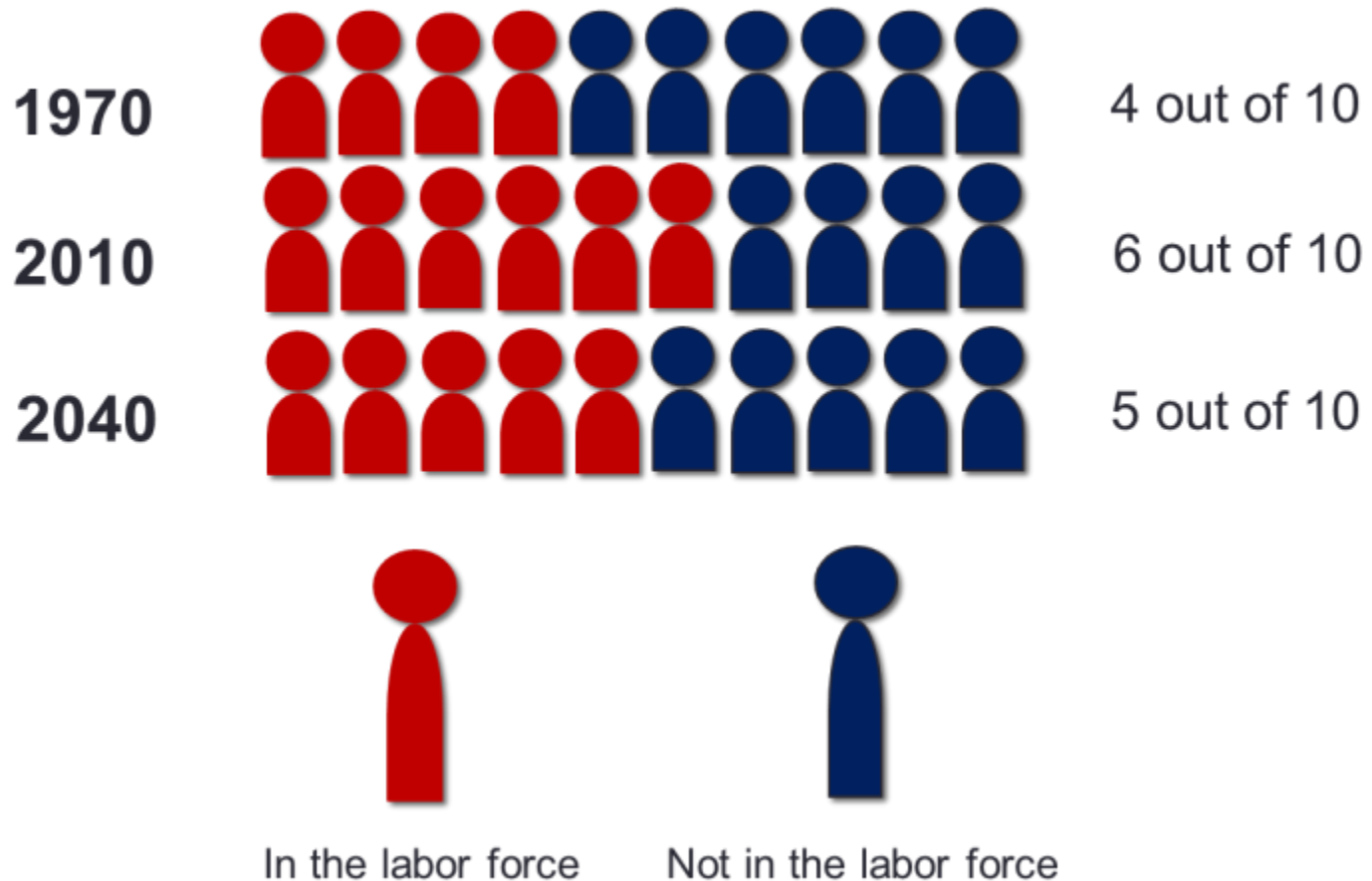
Share of youth and old age of 18-64 working age population





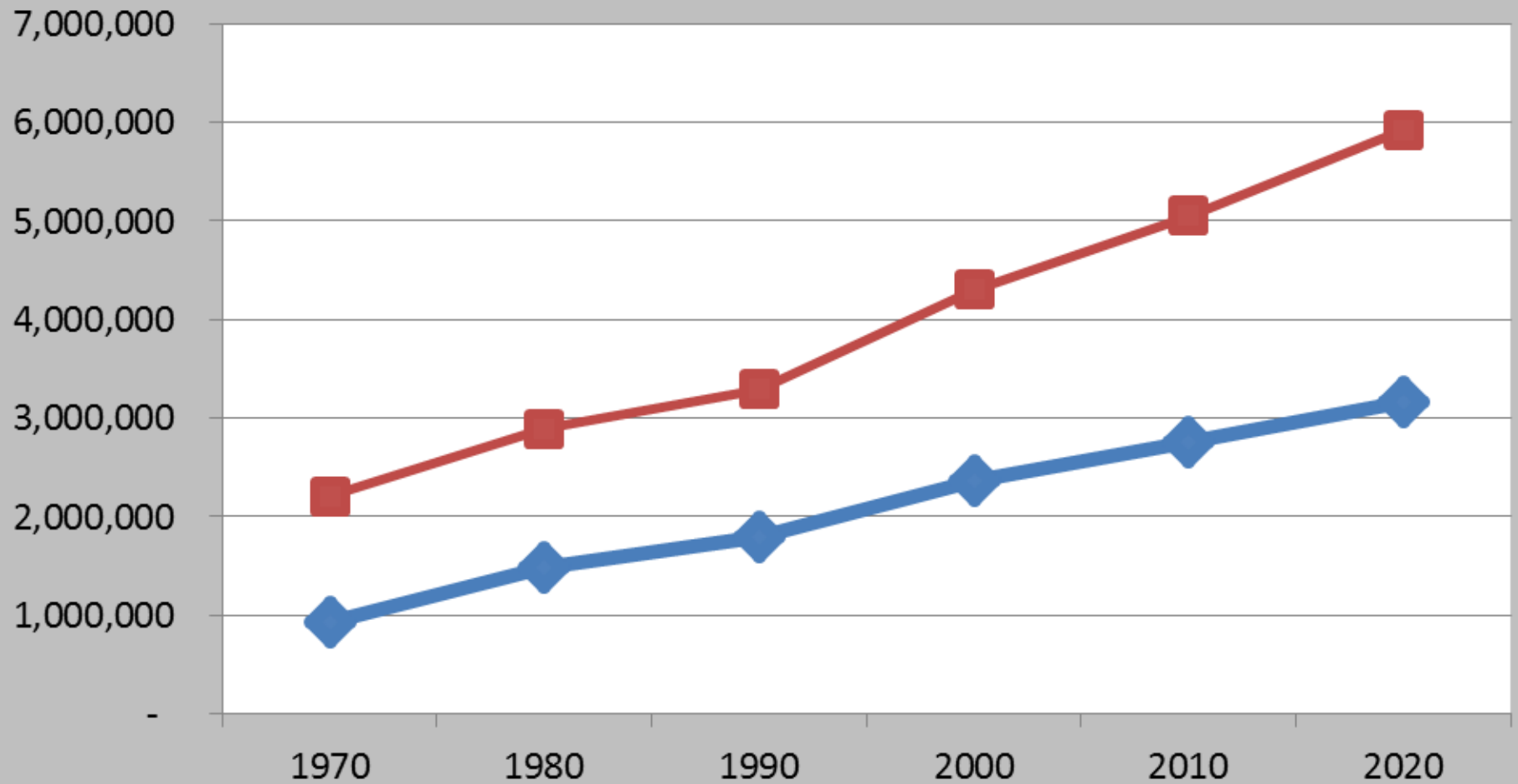
Share of population in labor force

Colorado reached a peak in the share of persons in the labor force near 2010.



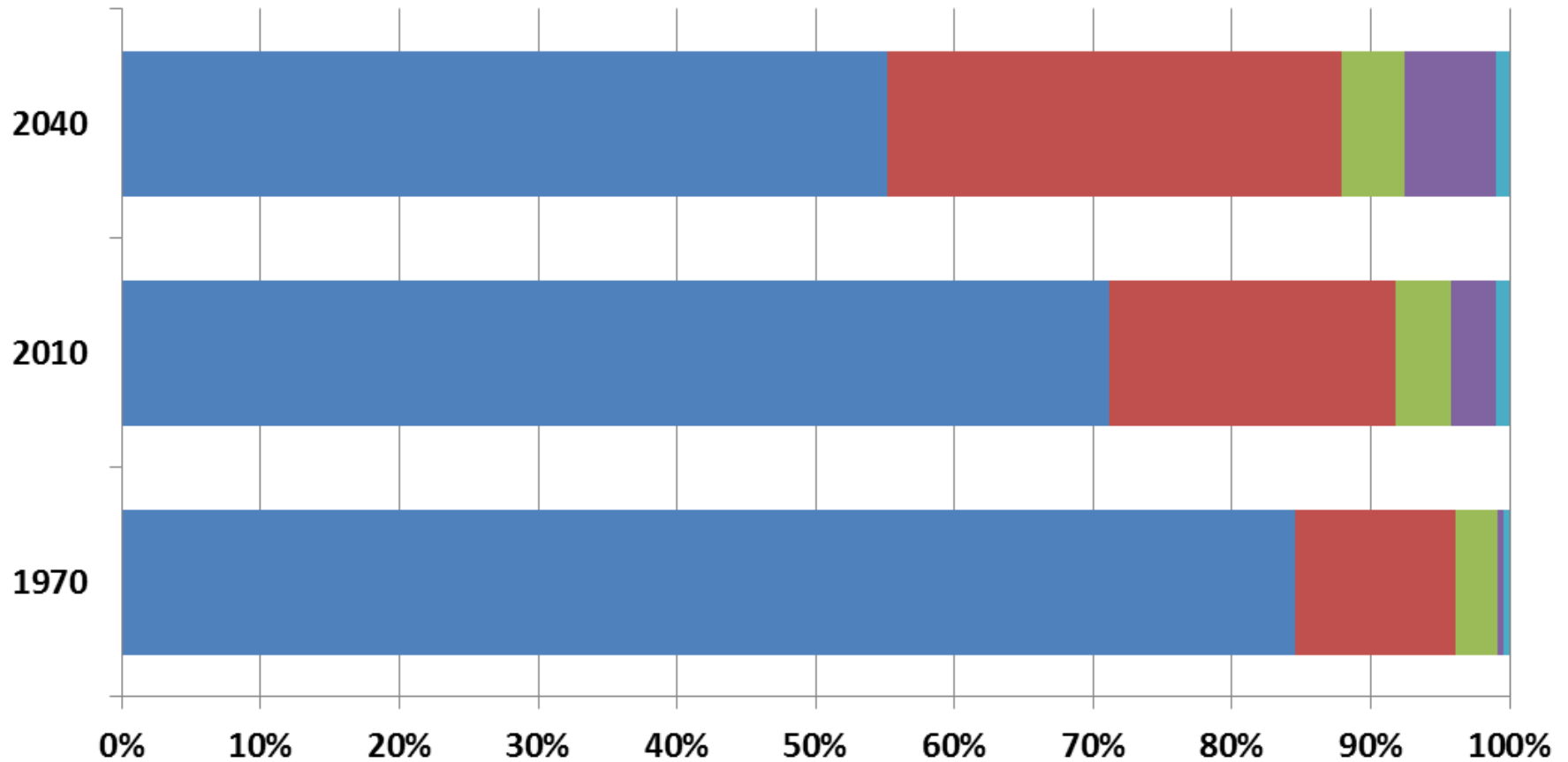
Population vs Labor Force

Labor Force Population



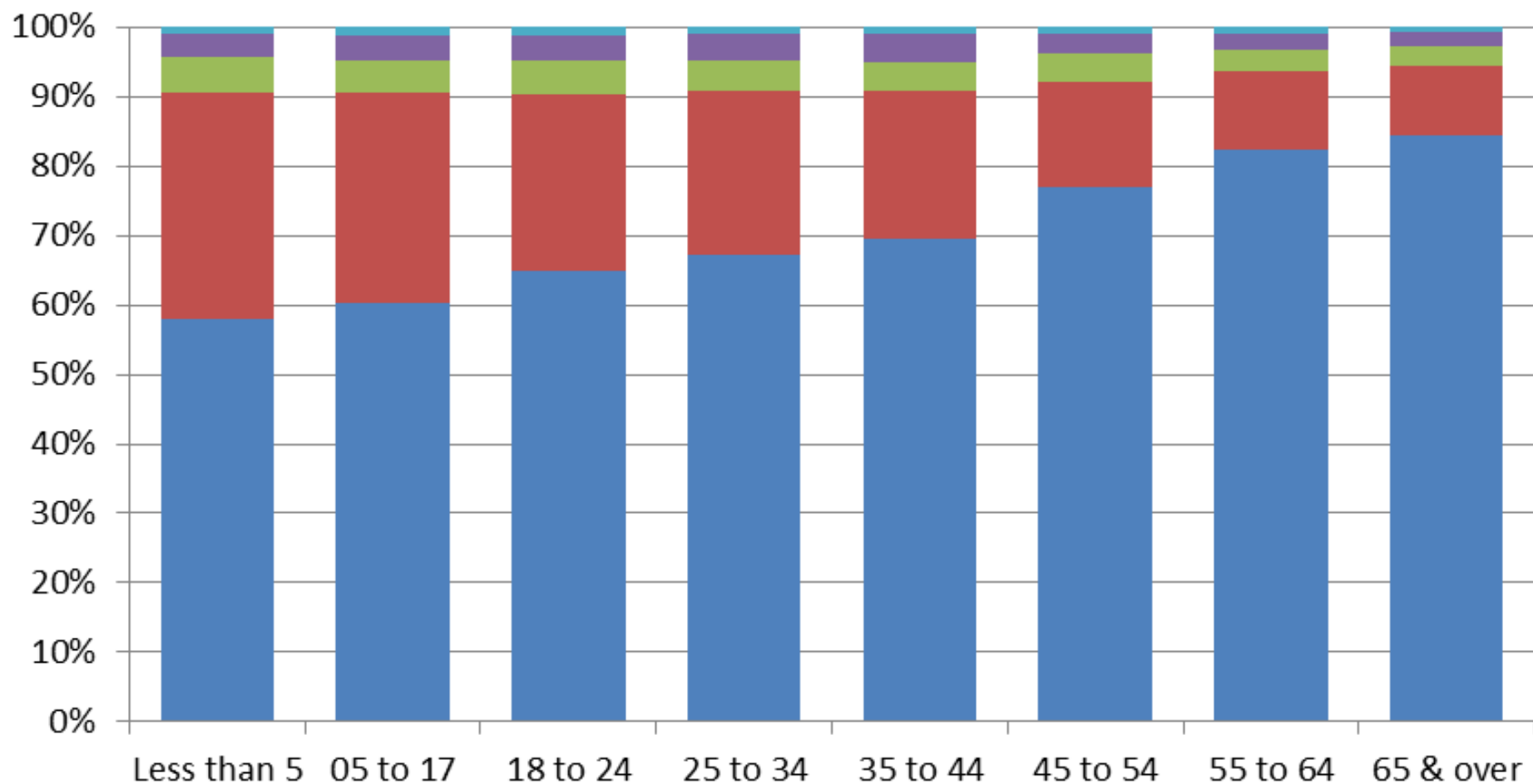
Colorado Population by Race/Ethnicity

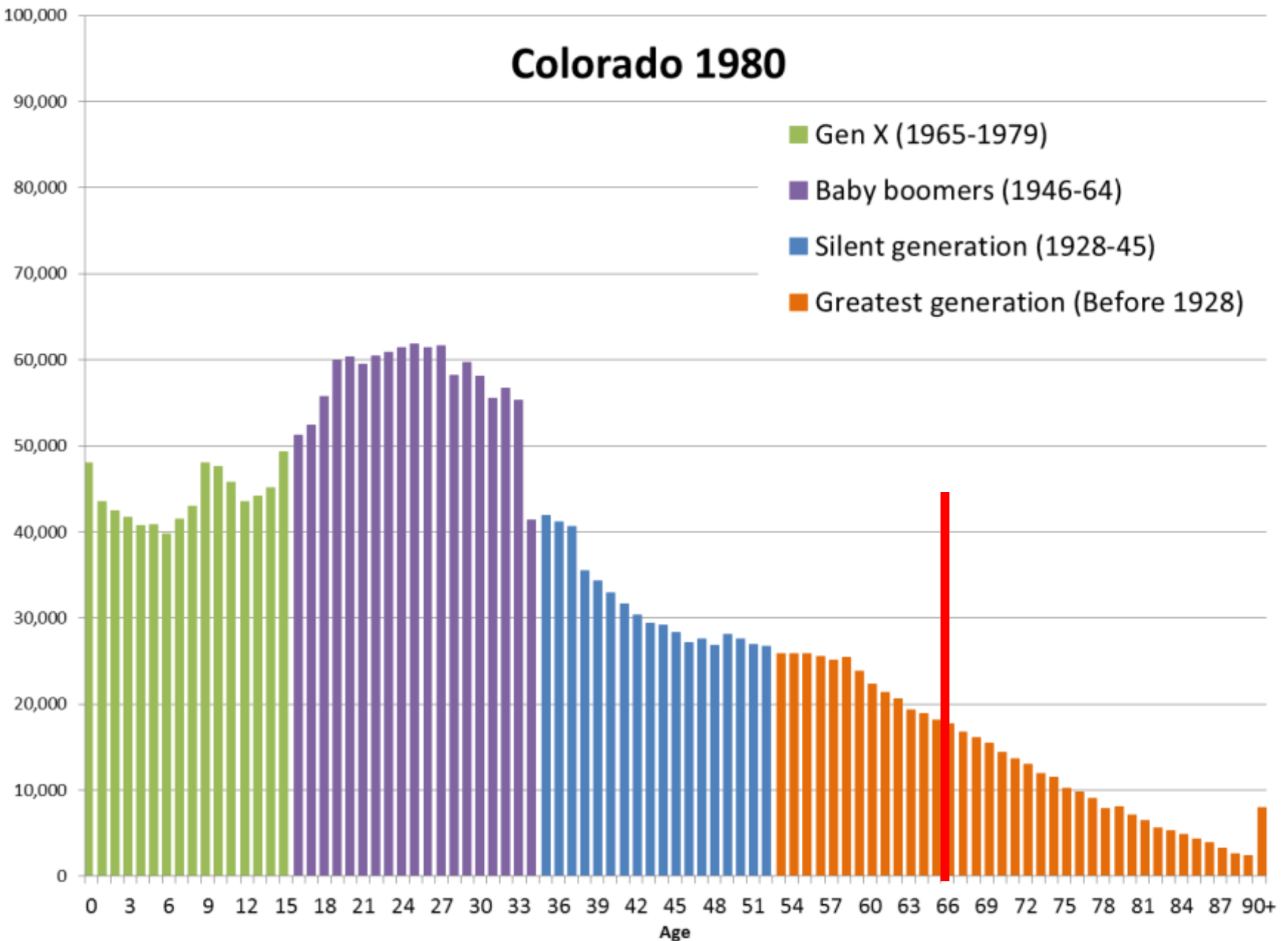
