Reading of the 7th Amendment

1. Title 44 Discussion & Library Updates

- Eric: brief Introduction: Focus on chapter 19; deals with FDLP
- GPO Asked for feedback
- Discussed DLC list of recommendations
 - Discussion of regionals: read definition of regional (find citation)
 - Only real restrictions only two per state and designated by Senate
 - Some sharing responsibility for retaining collections
 - Is housing really becoming the big driver? (McKinley) Yeah I think so. (Eric)
 - CU is relatively supportive, but a lot of space and cost pressures for many others.
 - Less regionals means more work; maybe make space available, but not more staff or money.
 - Regionals need weigh in on the amount of work they do
 - Kate: We have a lot of the things we would want to change, why would we change title 44 now?
 - This is coming from the JCP; FDLP libraries did not ask for this
 - Some regionals are threatening to withdraw from program. Not good for anybody.
 - Is DLC making an official comment or are we commenting on our own?
 - We are commenting and DLC will respond with official recommendations
 - Discussed some of the stakeholders in this process
 - Next steps? We need to show value. Advocacy outside FDLP, other orgs and writing congress when voting. Make it easier for others to become depositories.
 - Need to make some concessions, but what is the line?
 - Regionals can't contain too many states; that could lead to one regional in the country! But it is agreed that state lines don't always make sense.
 - Allow for arrangements that are already in place, but if we draw the line to far, it could lead to regional erosion
 - Multi-state shared repositories are problematic, it is important to have a regional that has everything in one place.
- To dos:
 - Provide feedback to GPO by Aug. 31, 2017, local (directors and deans) and professional advocacy

- What are potential rules that we would have to keep in place? What can we change? What are the consequences?
- Google form for feedback will be sent out. Follow up (Second week of Aug.) to develop group position
- Contact Eric with comments for DLC, submit individual feedback through FDLP form.

3. Library Updates:

- **DU:** three new ref librarians, 3 searches, Chris ending sabbatical in Sept.
- **CU Boulder:** Jim retired, a lot of interim people in leadership, microfiche project, got approval for a new cataloging position which is ½ Alliance funded, Head Gov Info on hiring plan
- **CU Law:** New fellow Carrie Ann Roe - Lawyer starting LIS degree, there is also a potential donor for digitization projects
- **Mines:** Hearings sent to ProQuest, Trail and AC digitization, may take all digital GPO;
- **COSPL:** Full catalog record link on website, new friday grab bag;
- **Colo College:** New Director starting, staff moving to new building, new microfiche withdrawal, thinking moving to offsite might ensure collection, but some concerns about access, partner with special collection,
- **UNC:** Mark retiring next summer, leaving collection in good shape e.g collection plans and collection decisions
- **AFAC:** director retired, search through fall, Feb-June for person in place, will be joining prospector;
- **Regis:** Dean going on sabbatical, two open positions;
- **CSU:** new bus librarian and science librarian, two part time librarians;
- **CMU:** new space challenges, bringing own version of viewfind;
- **Auraria:** Kelly gone for three months, two positions left, a bunch of new hires and open positions, major organizational change because of AD leaving, directory search restarting, renovations almost done;
- **Western:** Updating computer systems and space,
