Program Description:

Students explore the intersections of culture, language and English language learning and teaching in Chengdu, the dynamic capital of China's southwest Sichuan province. The linguistics course with its strong field-based component to

schools and classrooms delves into social, political, and cultural – not only linguistic and pedagogical- contexts for learning and using English in China. Bi-weekly visits to classrooms, programs and centers where English is being taught allow students to connect with English language learners and teachers. A small-scale project links each student with a Chinese student writing/conversation partner. Students also choose enrolling in a Chinese Language or Chinese/Asian culture course.
