The Multicultural Leadership Scholars (MLS) is for highly motivated students who want to study leadership from a multicultural perspective. Students take eight credits as part of their first year experience and have an interest in continuing their leadership studies throughout their CU Education. MLS is both a four-year academic pathway and a scholars community designed to promote leadership, excellence, achievement and diversity and is committed to supporting students in developing culturally competent leadership practices that will positively impact our world.

Deadlines: Scholarships will be awarded on a first-come first-serve basis to eligible applicants in batches at the end of each enrollment period (July 14<sup>th</sup>, July 21<sup>st</sup>, July 28<sup>th</sup>, August 3<sup>rd</sup> and August 11<sup>th</sup>). You may apply for the scholarship before you enroll in LEAD 1000, 005 <u>and</u> EDUC 2910, 001 but your scholarship will only be considered once your enrollment is confirmed.

Final Deadline: Any student applying by August 26<sup>th</sup>, and enrolled in LEAD 1000/005 and EDUC 2910/001 will be considered for the scholarship, if funding is available. Students who could have applied during an earlier enrollment date will be given lower priority.

The CU Leadership, Excellence, Achievement, and Diversity (LEAD) Alliance is a set of multidisciplinary academic neighborhoods whose students, faculty, and staff are united to promote diversity and educational excellence for our campus through access for students of color, first generation students, and those with financial need. The CU-LEAD Scholarship Fund aims to recruit and retain a diverse student body. The scholarship program offers a range of services and financial benefits for highly motivated individuals. Students enrolled in the Multicultural Leadership Scholar classes within the School of Education are eligible to apply for a \$8,000 CU LEAD Alliance Scholarship. Scholarship recipients will receive \$2,000 each year for four years contingent on full-time enrollment, reasonable academic progress and continued participation in the Multicultural Leadership Scholars program.
