Job Summary

The Summer Instructor is responsible for delivering academic instruction and supporting student success within the PEAC summer program through workshop facilitation, assessment and feedback, student engagement, and collaboration with program staff and student mentors. This role contributes to both the academic and community-building components of the program by providing instruction, maintaining regular student support,

and assisting with program operations. This is a non-tenure track appointment and is not renewable.

Who We Are

What Your Key Responsibilities Will Be

- Teach one section of six instructional workshops (90 minutes each)
- Teach two sections of recitation workshops (six total, 40 minutes each)

- Hold regular office hours to provide academic support to students
- Grade and assess all course assignments and evaluations in a timely manner
- Coordinate and communicate regularly with assigned student mentors
- Attend weekly instructor meetings to support instructional planning and alignment
- Attend weekly program staff meetings and contribute to team coordination
- Assist with student mentor training and coverage as needed
- Support community-building activities and student engagement initiatives
- Serve as an on-call staff resource for program-related emergencies
- Fulfill additional responsibilities necessary to support the successful delivery of the PEAC program in accordance with university and program policies
