
## MENV TIPS: FINDING FUNDING AND HOUSING


Tuition classification is governed by state law (Title 23, Article 7, of the Colorado Revised Statutes of 1973, as amended) and by judicial decisions that apply to all public institutions of higher education in Colorado, and is subject to change at any time.

#### YOU'RE PROBABLY A RESIDENT IF...

- You attended a Colorado high school for at least one year preceding the date of your graduation and you've lived in Colorado for at least 12 consecutive months before enrolling at CU Boulder.
- You (if you're 23 or older) or your parents (if you're under 23) have been <u>domiciled in</u> <u>Colorado</u> for one or more years.
- You're a <u>member of an American Indian tribe</u> with historical ties to Colorado.
- You're a dependent of or are yourself a qualifying member of the military (aid restrictions apply).

#### YOU'RE PROBABLY NOT A RESIDENT IF...

- You're under 23 and your parents haven't been domiciled in Colorado for one or more years.
- You're 23 or older and you haven't been domiciled in Colorado for one or more years.
- You're in possession of a nonimmigrant visa (F-1, F-2, H-3, M-1, M-2 or J-1).



### TUITION

In-State: ~\$65,399 (including tuition, fees and books) for 48 credits. This number does NOT include rent, groceries, etc.

Out of State: ~\$76,674 (including tuition, fees and books) for 48 credits. This number does NOT include rent, groceries, etc.

### SCHOLARSHIPS

- We offered our initial round of programmatic scholarships from the priority applicant pool.

# FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

- All graduate students (enrolled at least half time) who submit a FAFSA are eligible for the <u>Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan</u>. Note that MENV requires a five credit hour Capstone course in the summer.
- The "Academic Year 2025-26" is defined as Fall 2025, Spring 2026, and Summer 2026.
  - If a student receives an offer of \$20,500 in Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loans and accepts all funding in Fall 2025 and Spring 2026, there is no remaining eligibility for that loan in Summer 2026.
  - Graduate students may be eligible, however, to apply for an additional <u>Graduate PLUS Loan</u> or <u>private student loan</u> during the summer.

### **ASSET**

- The University of Colorado Boulder provides some grant and work-study assistance for Colorado resident students who are eligible under the Colorado Advancing Students for a Stronger Economy Tomorrow (ASSET) Bill or Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA).
- Nonresident students are ineligible for need-based assistance or the Colorado ASSET Bill benefit, but are encouraged to apply for scholarships.
- Liz Holland, Michelle Cadena, Bobbie Bryant, Brendan Park, and Myles Maland all hold UnDocuAlly certifications, so please reach out to with any questions, comments, or concerns you might have.





### WORKING IN GRADUATE SCHOOL

- CU Boulder's Student Employment service regularly posts job openings here. Jobs posted include:
  - Hourly Off-Campus jobs
  - Hourly On-Campus jobs
  - Work-Study jobs which require a need-based financial aid work-study award and FAFSA submission
- Graduate student assistantship (GSA)
  - Positions open on an as need basis to support faculty and staff
  - Positions are NOT teaching assistantships
  - GSA positions are part-time jobs that result in a bi-weekly paycheck directly deposited to your bank account
  - You must be admitted and enrolled in MENV before applying
- Note: International students can work on campus up to 20 hours a week while school is in session
  during the fall and spring semester. If a student has multiple on campus jobs, the total hours worked
  for all jobs cannot exceed 20 hours a week while school is in session. You can read more about this

### WORKING IN GRADUATE SCHOOL CONT.


90 students from MENV were surveyed about working while in the program.

### How does your job affect your studies?

- Over 50% of students said that their jobs had no real effect on their studies.
- 23% said their position helped them with their MENV studies as it put their coursework into practice.

### RESIDENTIAL ADVISOR POSITION

#### Job Requirements

- Completed at least two full-time (12 credit hours) semesters at the collegiate level by employment
- Must be a regularly enrolled, full-time student at CU Boulder
- Must have a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA on the date of job offer and the end of fall 2024 semester
  - Note: the minimum GPA for honors halls is 3.0, with additional requirements
- Must complete a criminal background check or show that one has been done within the last year
- Must continue to show academic progress by completing at least 12 credit hours per semester, excluding summers

#### Cost Savings

- Room and board and a meal plan are offered as compensation for the job.
- Up to 8 hours a week of compensated working hours are given (4 of which are required by the position).
- Normal undergraduate resident halls offer employment from August to May and Bear Creek
  - May to May: Ideal for MENV Students who needs to be in Boulder for the summer
- Graduate and Family housing offer similar positions called housing assistants. The job averages about 25
   hours a week of commitment time.



# PEACE CORPS, AMERICORPS AND VETERAN AFFAIRS

#### Peace Corps

 Under the Colorado <u>Tuition Classification for Peace Corps Volunteers Act</u> (effective Fall 2023), a student who would not otherwise qualify for in-state tuition and who was certified by the director of the Peace Corps as having served satisfactorily as a Peace Corps Volunteer, is eligible to be classified as an in-state student for tuition purposes.

#### AmeriCorps

- Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards can be used to pay for educational expenses at CU Boulder.
- The deadline for AmeriCorps requests is July 1.

#### Veteran and Military Affairs


- Eligible students may use their GI Bill® Benefits by applying for a VA Certificate of Eligibility(CoE) that can then be sent to CU Boulder Veteran and Military Affairs.
- The University of Colorado Boulder offers many other funding opportunities, such as the <u>Veteran</u> <u>Bridge Program</u>, on the <u>Veteran and Military Affairs website</u>.







#### **Use your Buff OneCard (student ID)**


- Biking:

  - Flatiron Flyer: transport to the airport
  - Bus to Eldora [N (RTD Ski-n-Ride)]: to Nederland and Eldora from Boulder Station
  - Ski Bus to Ikon Mountains: Students only.
     (Destinations vary)





### TIPS TO SAVE MONEY

#### **Utilize Student Discounts**

- Take advantage of student discounts offered by local businesses, restaurants, and entertainment venues.
  - Denver Museum of Nature and Science, Denver Botanic Gardens
- Always carry your student ID with you to ask about discounts
- Students will have access to Outdoor Pro Link once enrolled in MENV

#### **Food**

- Save money by cooking meals at home and bringing lunch to campus
- Attend on-campus events providing free food
- Download <u>Flatiron Meal Plan</u> for discounts
- Access the on-campus <u>Buff Food Pantry</u>
- Work with the Basic Needs Center or Liz to find out your eligibility for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)




### TIPS TO SAVE MONEY CONT.

- Explore student housing cooperatives to save on rent Live in neighboring communities like Broomfield, Lafayette, Longmont, or Denver




### TAKE ADVANTAGE OF CAMPUS RESOURCES
