

MENV DEGREE PLANNING GUIDELINES & WORKSHEET

The MENV degree planning worksheet is an unofficial document designed to assist MENV students with their degree planning and progress. It is the responsibility of the student to be as proactive as possible in tracking their academic progress towards meeting graduation requirements. Students should seek out the necessary resources to ensure academic progress is being made within the timeframe and policies set by the program, the graduate school, and the university.

Items to consider when completing the worksheet:

- Each student is required to complete 48 total credits: 9 MENV core, 9 Capstone, 18 Electives, & 12 specialization requirements. Refer to the required curriculum provided to you when you entered the program and utilize the [MENV Academic Advising website](#) for current resources and course lists.
- Students are strongly encouraged to meet with their MENV Academic Advisor prior to course registration each semester to seek assistance about course selection, degree progress, and any additional academic related concerns.
- Students petitioning for a modification in an administrative program function, such as a change of specialization, should meet with the [MENV Graduate Program Coordinator](#) for the necessary steps involved in the request.
- Refer to the [CU Boulder Academic Calendar](#) for all semester important dates/deadlines including course registration, add/drop deadlines with or without penalties, and university holidays.
- Students should review the [Graduate School Policies & Procedures](#) which provide essential information regarding degree requirements.
 - A few important degree requirements are listed below. These include, but are not limited to:
 - 48 credits at 5xxx level or above. A maximum of 6 credits of 3xxx/4xxx are permitted.
 - Transfer credits are limited to 9 credits, must be graduate credits that did not count towards another degree, and must be approved by the MENV program administration and the Graduate School.
 - Other items such as time limits for completion of degrees, grades and quality of work, pass/fail, etc. are all outlined in the [Graduate School Rules](#) document and should be considered as you continue with your degree planning and progress.
