

The faculty of the Music Education Department in the College of Music at the University of Colorado Boulder announce an opening for the **MacFerran Doctoral Fellowship in Music Education**. The successful applicant will be enrolled as a PhD student in music education.

Requirements

- Successful teaching experience in K-12 music
- A background in instrumental (band or orchestra) teaching is preferred for entry in fall 2021, but all
 applicants will be considered
- Evidence of strong academic record, musicianship, and leadership potential

Opportunities

In addition to the rigorous curriculum of the PhD program in music education, the MacFerran Doctoral Fellowship recipient will gain practical experience to support a career as a music teacher educator through opportunities to:

- Teach undergraduate courses as the instructor of record
- Serve as the editorial assistant for the Journal of Music Teacher Education
- Participate in leadership of the Middle School Ensemble and Trying on Teaching programs
- Mentor students in field experiences
- Participate in and assist with faculty research

Benefits

- 100% tuition waiver for six credits per semester
 - o (\$21,096 value first year out of state, \$7,884 per year in state years two and three)*
- Graduate Part-Time Instructor (GPTI) stipend \$15,798 per year*
- Additional scholarship funding \$5,000 per year
- Health Insurance allowance \$3,545 per year toward student health plan premium*
- Access to travel funding \$1,000 per year
- Dissertation funding \$1,000 available to support dissertation research, one-time award

Total value: \$113,893 over three years (*amounts based on 2020-2021 academic year) Fellowship support is offered for three academic years in residence at the CU Boulder campus.
