We believe that each student approaches graduate study with unique and personal goals.



The Summer Master of Music Education (M.M.E.) degree at the University of Colorado is designed to address a variety of interests, needs, and areas of expertise for K-12 teachers.

Students working toward an M.M.E. degree complete 12 hours of study in music education, 12 hours of study in music and 6 hours of open electives (can include study in any area in or outside of music).

Advisors work with you to design flexible degree plans that will allow you to select a combination of coursework and independent study options intended to support focused areas of music study in ensemble conducting (choral and instrumental), musicology, or technology. Additional music education electives address pedagogical practices, curriculum, and assessment in K-12 grade levels or group music teaching assignments (K-8 General Music, Middle/High School Music Electives).



Pathways to Graduation

The Summer M.M.E. degree can be completed over three summers (during our 4-week June session), with options for additional summer coursework (pre-session & July). We also offer on-campus/distance learning courses or independent study work each fall and spring semester for teachers who choose to spread out the required 30 credits. In addition, up to 9 graduate credits (from the past five years) may be approved for transfer into the degree.

Program Information

Courses rotate over three summers during a compressed 4-week term. To complete the degree students take 8-9 cr. each June as follows: 2-3 cr. required **Music Education** core/elective courses; 4-6 cr. required/elective Music courses, including 2 cr. Cognate study, for a total of 24 cr. hours. The remaining 6 cr. are available during pre-session workshops/July electives, or during the academic year (see website for course rotation chart). COST- For Summer 2020, \$650 per credit (no additional fees); **the per-credit rate is the same for BOTH in-state and out-of-state students.**

Open Electives (6 cr. hrs.)

Any elective or transfer course.

Instrumental Conducting: Intermediate Conducting, Advanced Conducting, Wind Band Conducting Symposium, and/or Private Conducting

Choral Conducting: Intermediate Conducting, Advanced Conducting, Choral Conducting Symposium, and/or Private Conducting

Musicology: Music History (special topics), and Musicology (World Music electives)

Technology: Applications of Music Technology, Advanced Music Technology, Independent Study in Music Technology

Music Courses: Electives

Courses from any cognate area. Additional electives such as Alexander Technique, Vocal or Advanced Instrumental Techniques, or World Music ensembles.
