## Program notes

This recital is presented in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Music. The recital includes a wide selection of music, ranging from classical to contemporary music, from western to eastern compositions.

The suite, Eight Memories in Watercolor is TanDun's opus 1 among all his works. He composed the work from 1978-1979. Tan Dun describes the work as 'a diary of longing' since this is the time when Tan was studying far away from his hometown. This suite is greatly inspired by Chinese instrumental playing and Chinese folk music. Every piece in the suite vividly pictures a unique subject which leads to a vastly contrasted experience with each, and every piece being performed.

## About the performer
