

## **Trombone Studio Listening Exam**

As part of the Sophomore Proficiency examination, each student must successfully complete the Listening Examination. The Proficiency Examination will not be considered passed until the Listening Exam is completed.

The Listening Exam can be taken at any time and as often as needed – before the Proficiency Exam is best. BM and BME students will pass with at least 80% accuracy. BA students will pass with at least 70% accuracy.

Random portions of selected works will be played and you will be asked to identify composer and title.
