Submitting A Music Education Graduate Application Video File Link

Thank you for your application to one of the music education graduate degree programs (Master of Music Education, Master of Music Education Plus Licensure, PhD in Music Education) in the College of Music at the University of Colorado Boulder. If you are interested in being considered for an assistantship position, please submit an unedited video of you teaching. This video (15-30 minutes in length) should be an example of you teaching a class or portion of a rehearsal.

Please submit your video via a third-party hosting website. You may use any service you wish to host your video file. Following is a list of sites that allow uploading and sharing of media with a free account:

YouTube (www.youtube.com)

Vimeo (www.vimeo.com)

Using the sites above or other similar services will allow you to host your video on the internet and share a link to that video with the application review committee. Regardless of the site you choose, it is critical that you mark your files so that they can be played by anyone with the link without requiring any login or user account. This requires you to set the privacy or sharing settings on each file. Typically, most sharing services offer a “public” mode that will allow your videos to be played by anyone. If you do not wish your media to be fully public, most services have some variation of an “unlisted” mode, meaning you can share a link and a person with that link can play your file, but the file cannot be found by searching like a public file can. Do not use private sharing that requires you to designate specific users that can view your files, as this will not allow the application committee members to review your video.

Submission Instructions

1. Upload your video to a sharing service.
2. In the body of a document (MSWord or PDF format), insert the link to your video.
3. Use the following heading for your document:
Last NameDegreeVideo (for example: BergPhDVideo)
4. Upload the document as a supplemental file with your University of Colorado application.
