**Uniform:** Full NWUs/MARPATs

- The competition begins at 0600 on March 7.
- Teams must check in at Kittredge Field 30 minutes prior to their assigned time.
- Color Guard teams must provide their own guidons, flags, and swords; rifles will be provided.
- Warming layers are permitted before and after competition but are not authorized while competing.

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## Shooting Competition

**Location:** CU Boulder Police Department Shooting Range  
1805 33rd St, Boulder, CO 80301

**Uniform:** Full NWUs/MARPATs with sleeves down

- The competition begins at 0500 on March 6.
- Check-in is at Gate 6, outside Folsom Field, at least 40 minutes prior to your scheduled time.
- Teams will compete in one-hour time blocks.
- Teams consist of four rifle shooters and four pistol shooters. The same four competitors may shoot both pistol and rifle if desired.
- Weapons and ammunition will be provided. **Personal weapons and ammo are strictly prohibited.**
- Personal eye and ear protection are authorized.
- Teams that fail to comply with weapon safety procedures will be disqualified from the event.
- Competitors are the only personnel allowed on the range. Staff are invited to spectate from the RSO booth.

For those who competed last year, the shooting competition will feel very familiar. We will be shooting on USPSA targets at Boulder Police Department's shooting range. Rifle competitors will be shooting the Smith & Wesson M&P 15-22. Pistol shooters will be shooting the Colt Government 1911 in .22LR. The exact course of fire including drills, time cutoffs, and distances can be found in the LOI.

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## Knowledge Competition

**Location:** Math Building, Room 100

**Uniform:** Full NWUs/MARPATs

- Teams must check-in by 1715 on March 6, immediately followed by a brief on the rules and the start of competition.
- Questions will be formatted in Quiz Bowl style (a more detailed description can be found in the LOI).

- There will be 3 pool rounds consisting of 3-4 teams per round, followed by the championship round.
- Pool rounds consist of 50 questions each. The championship consists of 60 questions.
- Winners of each pool round will compete in the championship.
- Topics include military history, vehicles and aircraft, ranks, famous officers and battles, weapons systems, and more.

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## Endurance Race Competition

**Location:** CU Boulder Campus and Chataqua (see LOI for detailed course)

**Uniform:** Boots and utilities, PTU's; Proper warming layers are authorized.

- All members must be present at the E-race guidelines and safety brief from 1700-1830 on Friday 6 FEB.
- Gear check out and staging will begin immediately after opening ceremony at Gate 6 on Friday 6 FEB.
- The E-race will be broken up into 2 sections, the Pool PT on Friday evening, and the outdoor portion on Saturday, 7 FEB.
- Teams must check in at Gate 6, outside of Folsom Field, 20 minutes prior to their start time.

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## IRON 4C

**Location:** Farrant Field

**Uniform:** Boots and utilities; warming layers are not authorized.

- Check-in will be immediately following the opening ceremony. Team Captains will check in with the AOIC on Farrant Field.
- The competition will be conducted in three sections: max push-up, max pull-up, and a running circuit.
- Scoring is based on a 300-point scale.
- Spectators will be allowed to view the event from any part of Farrant Field that does not interfere with the runner's path or the pushup and pullup areas.

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## Altitude Awareness

**Boulder sits at 5,430 feet above sea level. Proper preparation is essential for optimal performance and safety.**

### What is Altitude Sickness?

Altitude sickness occurs when the body struggles to adjust to reduced oxygen levels at higher elevations. Symptoms may include headaches, nausea or vomiting, fatigue, dizziness, and difficulty sleeping. Severe cases may involve confusion, loss of coordination, or significant shortness of breath and require immediate medical attention.

### How to prepare:

To reduce the risk of altitude sickness, competitors are encouraged to hydrate consistently before and throughout their stay, prioritize rest and recovery, consume a carbohydrate-rich diet, and avoid alcohol while limiting caffeine intake. Corpsmen will be positioned along the endurance race to provide medical

support. If symptoms develop, notify your teams guide immediately and proceed to the nearest proctored station, where water, electrolytes, and light snacks will be available. The safety and well-being of all participants remain our highest priority.

## **Food & Hydration**

Each unit is responsible for their own food and hydration and should plan accordingly.

Only light snacks will be available along the endurance racecourse. Water and electrolyte packets will be readily available at proctored stations throughout the event.

## **Transportation**

The bus stops closest to the event locations are Buffalo Folsom Field Plaza and Colorado Avenue & Folsom Street.
