Subj: APPROVED COURSE LIST

Ref: (a) NSTC M-1533.2D, "Regulations for Officer Development"

1. Purpose. To promulgate the University of Colorado Naval Reserve Officer Training Command (NROTC) list of University of Colorado courses which fulfill the requirements of Reference (a).
2. Policy. The following University of Colorado courses are approved to fulfill the NROTC Academic Requirements of Reference (a). Students may petition the Commanding Officer to have other courses considered on a case by case basis.
