<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Subrecipients (interchangeable with Subawardee and Subcontractor). A subagreement is for the purpose of carrying out a portion of the scope of work on a sponsored award.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Vendors / Consultant. A procurement is for the purpose of obtaining goods and services for the non-Federal entity's (University of Colorado) own use on a sponsored award and creates a procurement relationship with the vendor/consultant.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If any of the following characteristics apply to the recipient of sponsored award funds, it will be treated as a Subrecipient:<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Determines who is eligible to receive what sponsor funding; and/or2) Has its performance measured in relation to whether objectives of the program were met; and/or3) Has responsibility for programmatic decision making; and/or4) Is responsible for adherence to applicable program requirements specified in the sponsored award; and/or5) In accordance with its agreement, uses the sponsored funds to carry out a program.• Subagreements can only be issued to entities, not individuals.• Office of Contracts and Grants issues awards to Subrecipients.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Some characteristics indicative of a procurement relationship between University of Colorado and a vendor/consultant are when the entity receiving the sponsored award funds:<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Provides the goods and services within normal business operations; and/or2) Provides similar goods or services to many different purchasers; and/or3) Normally operates in a competitive environment; and/or4) Provides goods or services that are necessary support to the operation of the sponsored award; and/or5) Is not subject to compliance requirements of the sponsored award, though similar requirements may apply for other reasons.• University Procurement Service Center issues purchase orders to vendor/consultants.
