Boulder, Colorado	 is nestled against the eastern foothills of the Rocky Mountains at an elevation of 5,430 feet (1,655 m) is located 30 minutes northeast of Denver, Colorado's state capitol has a population of approximately 100,000 (which includes CU-Boulder's 30,000 students) is about an hour from Denver International Airport (with public transportation readily available) is a center for outdoor activities with miles of bicycle trails and hiking trails, and easy access to mountain climbing and skiing 	towns/Boulder
Climate	 Boulder has a dry climate typical of much of the state, and enjoys over 300 sunny days each year. Students who arrive in August will encounter hot weather that will gradually cool through the fall. Students who arrive in January will initially encounter cold and windy weather. Temperatures are somewhat unpredictable year round. It can be warm in the winter and cool in the summer. Summer maximum temperatures are in the low 90° F range (about 32° C). Winters are cool to occasionally bitterly cold, with highs averaging 7-9° C (mid to upper 40° F). Lows may plummet below freezing during winter nights, but extended subzero cold is uncommon.
