2019 Assessment Overview

- 3 areas of program evaluation
 - Efficacy
 - Liking
 - Helping Attitudes
- 6714 first-year students were invited to take the survey
- 5130 gave complete responses (76% response rate)
- Survey period: September 22 October 1
- 2019 results similar to findings from previous 9 years

- 3578 White (1860 women, 1718 men)
- 2292 non-resident
- 2838 resident
- 613 Member of a historically marginalized identity pertaining to sex assigned at birth, sexual orientation, or gender (including, but not limited to gay, lesbian, pansexual, bisexual, asexual, intersex, transgender, non-binary, fluid, genderqueer, and agender)
- 3673 Straight
