- Peer mentorship





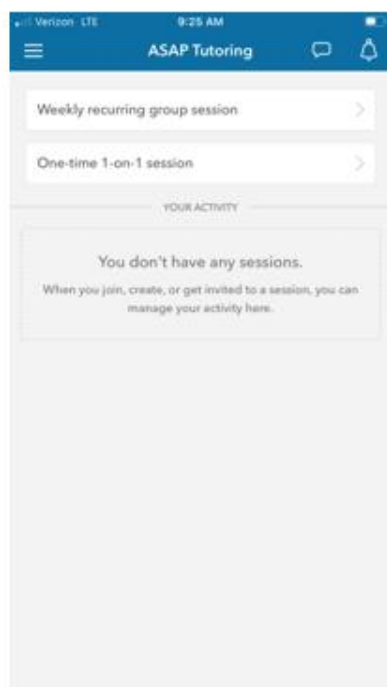
Who We Are

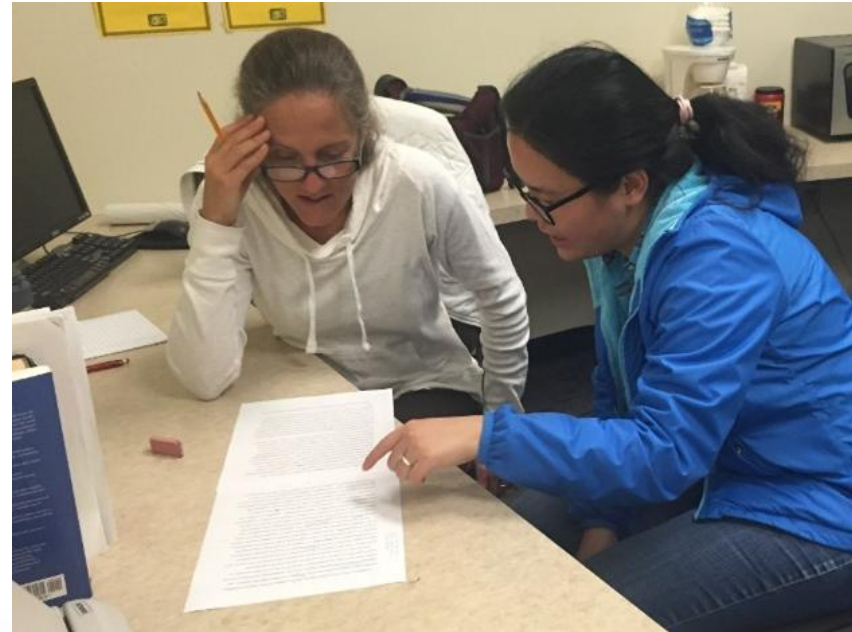

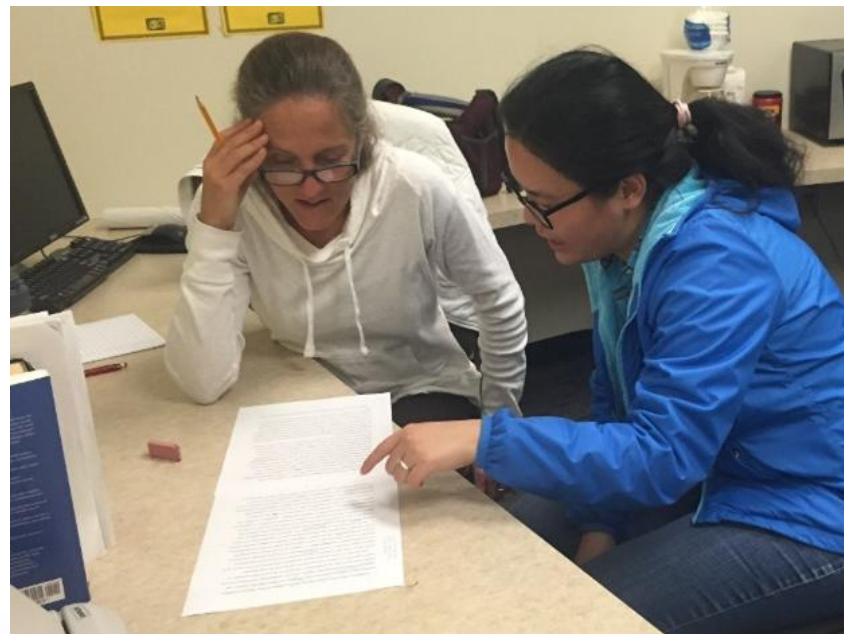
What is the Writing Center?

- **Develop** proper citation skills; avoid unintentional plagiarism



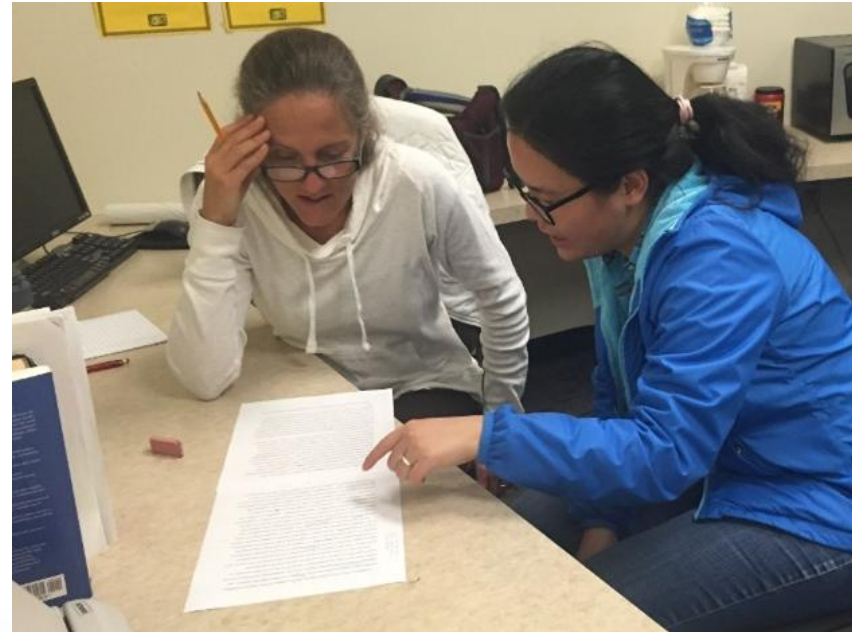
Who Visits the Writing Center?

- Faculty, staff, and alumni



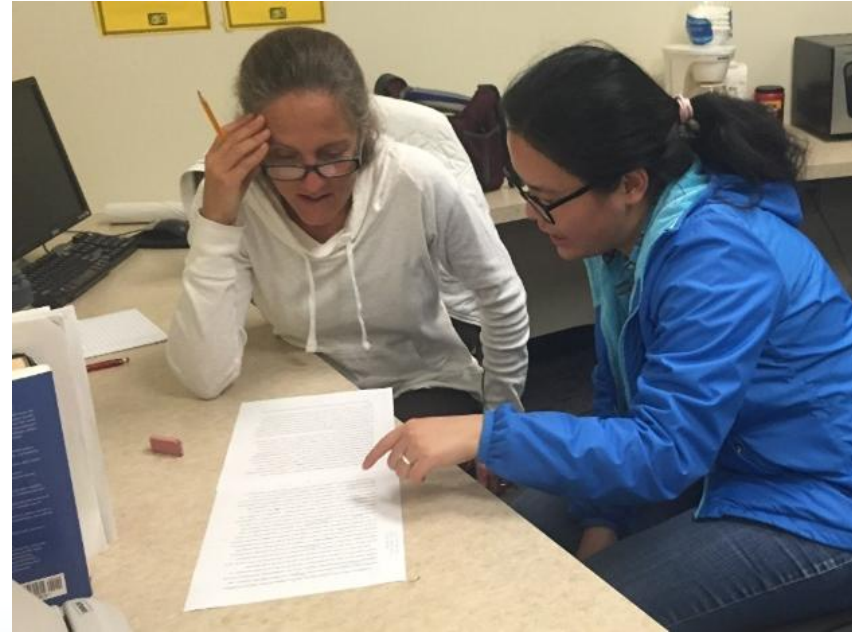
What We Offer

- Remote sessions via Zoom



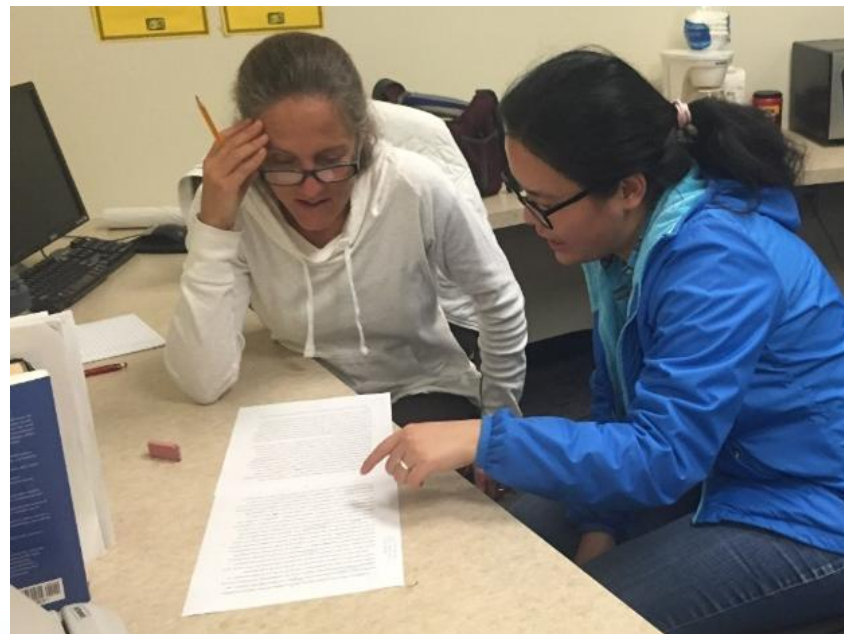
Who We Are
