



Bachelor's–Accelerated Master's (BAM) Program Requirements Checklist

To complete the Bachelor's–Accelerated Master's (BAM) Program, students must fulfill separately all requirements for the B.A. and thesis-based M.A. with the exception that two 4000-level courses can satisfy requirements for both the B.A. and the M.A. In addition to these two overlapping 4000-level courses, the student must complete all of the remaining requirements for the General Major in Philosophy (<https://tinyurl.com/major-reqs-pdf>) as well as for the thesis-based M.A. in Philosophy (<https://www.colorado.edu/philosophy/graduate/ma-program>).
