- Logic Requirement (through predicate logic)
- □ Coursework, including Distribution Requirements (45 credits / 15 courses[†]):
 - □ Values Proseminar
 - □ second Values course
 - □ third Values course
 - □ Metaphysics & Epistemology Proseminar
 - □ second M&E course
 - □ third M&E course
 - \Box one course in Ancient history
 - \Box one course in Early Modern history
 - □ third history course, in any area of or figure from history (up to about 1950)
 - □ first elective[‡]
 - \Box second elective
 - \Box third elective
 - \Box fourth elective
 - □ fifth elective
 - \Box sixth elective
- Diagnostic paper (due at start of 3rd sem., or 1st sem. on accelerated track)
- Qualifying paper (due at start of 5th sem., or 3rd sem. on accelerated track)
- Advancement to Prospectus Stage (by vote of the faculty)
- □ Prospectus and Prospectus Defense
- Dissertation and Oral Defense (including having taken 30 dissertation credit hours)
