Uganda & Rwanda

Dr. Jamie Van Leeuwen has partnered with the Global Livingston Institute (GLI) to host a Maymester course in East Africa for the sixth consecutive year. Dr. Jamie Van Leeuwen founded the GLI in 2009 after traveling to Uganda and Rwanda as part of the Livingston Fellowship he received from Bonfils-Stanton Foundation. During his travels, he became aware of the many people and NGOs taking actions in East Africa without truly understanding the needs of the community. He identified the need for people to do more listening and thinking before acting. Ultimately, the idea was to get students and community leaders to rethink the approach we take to international development. Since 2009, the GLI has been engaging students and community leaders in the United States and East Africa to Listen. Think. Act.

The overarching learning objective is to bring a set of policy and practice issues to life in an applied setting. Students will achieve this by accessing a range of relevant stakeholders and agencies in action. Throughout the course, students will be exposed to a series of dialogues, conversations, and interactions with the grassroots leaders of several distinct communities, government officials, entrepreneurs, university professors, public sector agencies, and many others throughout East Africa. We hope that these conversations will prepare students to think globally and act locally.

What is a CU Denver Global Study program?

A Global Study program is a CU Denver course that takes place in another part of the world. CU Denver faculty lead and teach a wide range of Global Study programs worldwide. These programs are designed with the CU Denver student body in mind: costs are reasonable and they are short-term to allow busy students to fit studying abroad into their schedule. This course also fulfills the International Perspectives requirement.

Financial Aid

CU Denver students may be able to use their existing financial aid for Global Study programs. Note that Maymester programs are considered part of the Summer term for financial aid. In order to be eligible for financial aid, students must be registered for at least half-time status (6 credits for undergraduates, 3 credits for graduates) during the Summer term.
