Study & Walk-About in East Africa with the Global Livingston Institute this Summer!

The GLI - in partnership with PLC at CU Boulder - is looking for highly motivated and intellectually curious students to engage in an immersion course and unique experiential learning opportunities to think differently and think big about how we approach international development in East Africa. From public health to social impact, your experiences this summer in East Africa will change you!

The GLI - PLC Partnership

The Global Livingston Institute (GLI) encourages everyone to **LISTEN** and **THINK** before they **ACT**.

The focus of GLI is not to fix Africa but to listen and think about the experiences that you are having with the people you meet and the communities you visit. Spend time getting to know and learn about the people who live and work in the communities where you travel and engage in a rich dialogue with business leaders, NGO leaders, government leaders, artist, educators, small business owners, and community members in Uganda and Rwanda about what it means to impact positive change. What does it really mean to build a partnership with the people of East Africa?

GLI & Presidents Leadership Class have formed a strategic partnership to engage students in international development in Uganda and Eastern Africa. Students have the opportunity to earn credit during Maymester by taking PSCI 4995 – International Development in East Africa – a three credit course facilitated by GLI in East Africa. In addition, students have the opportunity to extend their trip to fulfill their lower- or upper-division walkabout. *GLI has a comprehensive understanding of PLC requirements – including lower- and upper-division walkabout requirements.*

PSCI 4995 – International Development in East Africa (3 Credits)

This course is designed for students who are interested in understanding and addressing policy related to international development, public management, and public health practices. Our goal at the GLI is to individualize your experiences and make your time in Uganda and Rwanda transformational and life changing! We want you to build your outcomes not before you leave but based on your experiences when you are there. You will spend time in the slums of Kampala and with former child soldiers in Lira; you will meet with the medical teams at the jungle clinic in Lira and Mulago Hospital in Kampala. And with each person you meet and each experience you have and each conversation that takes place, what do you do with what you learn? How will your conversations and your dialogues in Uganda and Rwanda define the approach you take to your work either in East Africa or whatever part of the world to which you return. After you listen and think we want to turn you loose and see what you come up with to impact positive change in your corner of the world! Simply put, our vision is global.



Logistics of Course

- **Application Due Date:** March 1, 2016
- **Program Dates**
 - Arriving in Uganda: May 16, 2016
 - Departing Rwanda: June 2, 2016
- **Cost:** \$5,370 (see below for information on financial aid & scholarship opportunities)
- **What's included?** Tuition and fees, shared accommodation, entrance fees, most meals, ground transportation, & health insurance
- **What's not included?** Airfare, vaccines (if necessary), visa fees, some meals, and personal expenses

Lower- & Upper-Division Walkabouts in East Africa

GLI has built strong partnerships with a number of national and community leaders in Uganda. PLCers have the opportunity to extend their time in Uganda for an additional 2-6 weeks after the Maymester course and fulfill their lower- or –upper division walkabout. Students at CU Boulder can cross enroll with the UC Denver campus to receive academic credit. Typically students receive elective credit within the Political Science Department, but please work with your advisor to see how PSCI 4995 will fit in within your degree requirements. GLI offers three walkabout “paths” in the public, private, and public health sector of Uganda that allow students to engage in an individualized internship program with national and local leaders. These paths give students the opportunity to immerse themselves in the complexity of international development abroad and further their professional development by learning how to work with leaders in a global context.

Financial Aid

You can reach out to the CU Boulder Office of International Education to determine your individual eligibility for financial aid during the Maymester term.

Scholarships & Enrichment Funding

Students should strongly consider applying for enrichment funding to help subsidize their costs. In addition, students can reach out to their respective academic departments to seek funding that could help cover costs incurred during a walkabout (especially research initiatives). Lower-Division Walkabouts in Denver

In addition to the lower- and upper-division walkabout opportunities in East Africa, PLCers have the opportunity to engage with GLI through our internship program in our Denver office. *GLI's internship program meets the requirements for lower-division walkabouts.* PLCers supporting Denver operations will have the opportunity to work closely with GLI staff and local community partners to further their professional development and learn how to engage in international development. GLI engages interns as staff and relies on them for a variety of strategic work including but not limited to preparing briefs, managing long-term research projects, and coordinating community events and public outreach. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis.
