**Ethical Dilemma:**

A high-ranking government official who is overseeing every aspect of a disaster relief project is caught embezzling funds meant for aid. This has severely hurt thousands of people who rely on the aid, but the official responsible is crucial to the disaster relief effort. As the judge presiding over this case, you have to decide if you want to sentence this individual to years in prison, or grant them clemency so that they can keep assisting with the relief.

Sentencing them to a long prison term would uphold justice and deter corruption but would delay future relief efforts, prolonging the community's suffering. However, not issuing a sentence would allow the official to continue working on the disaster relief effort, but it could be perceived as overlooking serious wrongdoing.
