### **PLC ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS**

Members of the Presidents Leadership Class are required to take four (4) PRLC courses over the course of their undergraduate career. It is also encouraged that PLC students take LEAD 4000 to complete the Leadership Studies Minor as a capstone to the PLC curriculum.

PLC Students must complete courses in the following requirement areas:

- 1. First-Year Foundations & Applications (6 credits)
- 2. Multi-Level Leadership (3 credits)
- 3. Global Leadership (3 credits)
