• CLASS •

As a scholar in the Presidents Leadership Class, you will earn an academic Leadership Studies Minor through the completion of the unique PLC pathway of courses. There are four PLC courses, designed to be taken sequentially, that address a widening focus on leadership starting with individual ethics and ending with a look at leadership issues on a global scale. To receive the minor, you will also take a Leadership Capstone course that provides a summative look at your experience and growth as a student of leadership at the University of Colorado Boulder.



• COMMUNITY •

At PLC, you are part of a small family of highly driven peers with a dedicated staff that offers you individualized support throughout your undergraduate experience. The support you get from the program and your PLC peers is immediate and lasting; providing guidance and reinforcement with everything from your academics to your social life, and from balancing your busy schedule to managing the culture shock of coming to college.
