Internship Description:

The Laboratory to Combat Human Trafficking is a leader in Colorado's anti-trafficking movement. Our Leadership Development Program exists to prepare human rights leaders and survivors with the knowledge, skills, and professional development opportunities necessary to contribute to the anti-trafficking movement. Since 2005, LCHT has supported over 150 interns in their journey to becoming human rights leaders. We encourage traditional academic internships as well as non-traditional community-based internships.

Interns participate in a 12-week program for a minimum of 150 hours across four focus areas:

1. Training and Education
2. Research and Action
3. Hotline and Resource Directory
4. Development and Communications

Every internship combines an educational approach to the study of human trafficking and leadership with on-the-ground practice. Interns shadow speaking events, attend task force meetings, and travel for events when appropriate. We seek to equip interns with a leadership framework and skills that they can bring to their community and career. This is facilitated through our leadership curriculum, one-on-one support, and other training opportunities.
