

Endangered Species Coalition is hiring interns to help run our campaign to protect wildlife!

We are in the midst of the sixth mass extinction, and habitat loss and fragmentation are the biggest drivers of species decline worldwide. Colorado is no exception, but the state does have an opportunity to emerge as a leader in preserving wildlife and connecting wild spaces.

Our campaign is centered around elevating the voices of constituents so that elected officials at both the local and state level understand that this is a priority issue.

We can ensure that wildlife and the spaces that they depend on - and that we enjoy through hiking, fishing, camping, and more - are protected and connected to create more resilient ecosystems. As students, you are in a fantastic position to make a difference in your state.

We are looking to hire 3 - 5 students or recent graduates who are passionate about protecting wildlife and making social change. If this opportunity is of interest to you, I highly encourage you to <u>fill out this quick internship application</u>. After you fill out the application, we will get in contact about scheduling an interview. This is an unpaid internship that will provide you the opportunity to hone valuable skills like public speaking, managing and training volunteers, setting goals and tracking results, and--most importantly--making a real difference on a critical issue. Interns are expected to spend about 8-10 hours per week working on the campaign, but schedules are very flexible around class and work. In Colorado, the focus is on building wildlife corridors. We are hoping to get people across the state involved in speaking out and making it clear that we want Colorado to be a leader in conservation and habitat connectivity.
