We provide a safe environment for a child to spend time with a parent while that parent is working on behavioral issues such as domestic abuse, drug and/or alcohol abuse, severe mental illness or family reunification.</p> <p>Our services are designed with an emphasis on safety - separate entrances, staggered arrival and departure times, video surveillance and keypad access entries.
