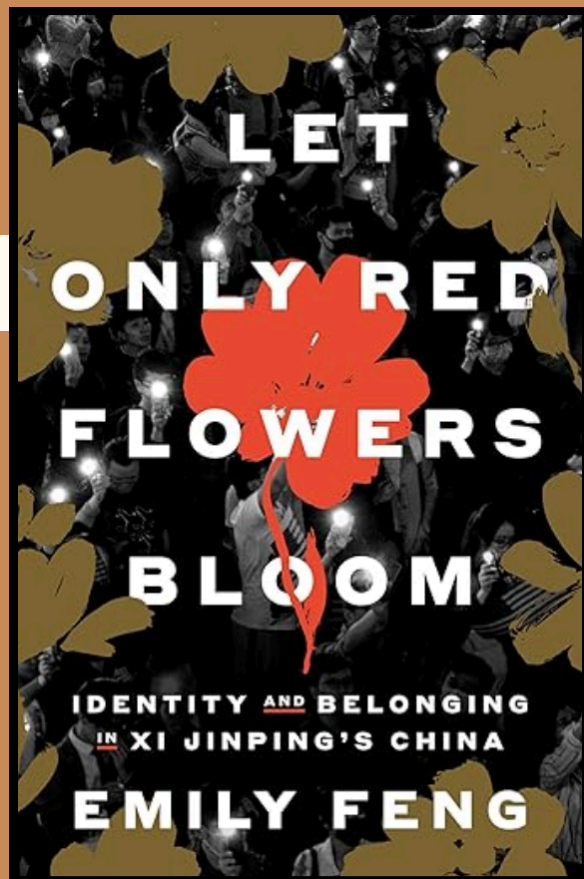


MODERN CHINA TRANSFORMED:

XI JINPING'S POLICIES AND THEIR HUMAN IMPACT



ONLINE SEMINAR FOR SECONDARY TEACHERS

This course explores the transformative era of Xi Jinping's leadership in China, focusing on his key policies and their impact on Chinese society through a reading of Emily Feng's newly published *Let Only Red Flowers Bloom: Identity and Belonging in Xi Jinping's Era*. Emily Feng is an international correspondent for NPR covering China, Taiwan and beyond. The course will include a look at the impacts on business, the rule of law, human rights, women, minority populations including the Uyghurs, and Hong Kong.



SEPT 13 - OCT 29, 2025

Course Format:

The seminar includes six asynchronous weeks with readings and discussions. Online introductions begin on September 13, 2025, and modules run from September 18 to October 29, 2025. A Curriculum Implementation Plan (CIP) is due November 11, 2025. Participants are **required to attend two live webinars** at 7 pm ET:

- Sept. 18 with Tim Weston, Associate Professor of Chinese History, CU Boulder
- Oct. 29 with author Emily Feng, NPR correspondent

Eligibility:

- Open to secondary teachers with priority for those in world history, global studies, AP comparative government, humanities, and language arts. Limited to 25 teachers.
