
**FALL 2017 ONLINE BOOK GROUP NOW REGISTERING**

***China's Millennials: The Want Generation*  
Led by Author Eric Fish**

**A Professional Development Course for High School Teachers**

**Overview:** Take advantage of a rare opportunity to explore stories of China's "millennials" with the author! Join author Eric Fish in a four-part online book group on his highly acclaimed 2015 publication, *China's Millennials: The Want Generation*. Through 15 profiles, *China's Millennials* captures the dreams and challenges of young adults in China today and provides high-interest, timely, and highly readable resources for the classroom.



**The National Consortium for Teaching about Asia (NCTA)** at the **Program for Teaching East Asia, University of Colorado Boulder**, invites applications for this fall 2017 online book group.

**Online Format and Participation Requirements:** The book group will be conducted entirely through four asynchronous online modules, each focusing on a theme or challenge faced by China's millennial generation and Chinese society as a whole: "Getting Educated," "Going to Work," "Coping" in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, and "Pushing Back" against the government. Participants are responsible for buying the book (available in hardcover and Kindle edition from Amazon) in advance of the book group start date. Book group members agree to participate fully in all four module discussions, submit a short Classroom Implementation Plan (CIP) describing ways to use the book in their teaching, and complete an evaluation.

**Eligibility and Selection:** High school literature, social studies, and Chinese language teachers are eligible to apply. Admission is selective and priority will be given to grade 9-12 contract teachers whose required curriculum in one of these subject areas includes contemporary China and who are not enrolling in another fall 2017 NCTA course through TEA.

**Book Group Dates:** The course begins with online introductions, September 22-28, 2017. The four modules run September 30-October 13; October 14-27; October 28-November 10; and November 11-30 (with additional time for Thanksgiving break). A short Curriculum Implementation Plan and evaluation, due on December 11, complete the course for those participants wishing to receive a certificate of contact hours and a completion award.

**Participation is free, with the following benefits for full participation, as outlined above.**

- Certificate of Completion for 16 contact hours;
- *Education About Asia* subscription and a completion award.
