## Teaching Japan through Geographic and Historical Lenses

Japan can provide a case study of broad geographic and historical processes when considering global interconnections in secondary social studies education. This workshop will feature presentations on Japan's geography and early modern Japan's domestic and foreign policies (1543-1868) by Professor Michelle Damian, Monmouth College. These presentations will be accompanied by curriculum demonstrations that will provide participants with ways to incorporate the academic content and skills development into their curriculum. As per the Iowa Social Studies Standards, the skills addressed will include historical thinking, geographic thinking, inquiry, and visual analysis.

**Format and Expectations:** The workshop will include: 1) academic presentations that provide an overview of the geography of Japan and historical background of early modern Japan (mid-16<sup>th</sup> to mid-19<sup>th</sup> centuries); and 2) curriculum demonstration and discussion. The workshop will be held a day prior to the Iowa Council for the Social Studies Conference on Sunday, October 3, 2021 from 9am – 4pm at the Marriott West Des Moines. Workshop participants agree to:

- Participate for the full program and complete a workshop evaluation; and
- Undertake modest (1-2) hour reading prior to the workshop.

**Eligibility and Registration:** Secondary social studies teachers who teach in Iowa are invited to register. Enrollment is limited to 20 teachers; registrations will be accepted on a rolling admission basis. Registration closes September 24, 2021, or when full.

- \$60 stipend for full attendance at the workshop.
- Workshop materials including curriculum resources incorporating primary sources.
