Collegiate Recovery Center Campus Housing

The CORE Living program provides the opportunity for members of the CU collegiate recovery community to live and learn together in a 4-plex apartment courtyard by Boulder Creek on the north side of campus.

CORE Housing is open to full-time freshman, transfer, upperclass and graduate students who:

- Have made personal commitment to living a substance-free lifestyle and are active Core Members of the CUCRC
- · Have maintained continuous abstinence from all drugs and alcohol for a preferred minimum of six months
- Participate in a program or practices that support personal growth, health and well-being
- Are interested in being part of a sobriety- and recovery-focused community, sharing support with other students
- Commit to upholding the community values and guidelines



Students qualify for CORE Housing by applying to become a Core Member or Ally Member of the CU Collegiate Recovery Center (CUCRC), which facilitates the CORE campus housing program. The CUCRC offers sober social activities, recovery meetings, professional staff and peer support. CORE Members are committed to having a community free from the influence and impact of alcohol and other drugs. CORE Members are willing to be of service to others and uphold community values and guidelines.

How to Apply

- 1. Contact us at cucrc@colorado.edu or (303) 492-9642 to discuss your interest and obtain application materials
- 2. Submit application to become a Core member or Ally member of the CUCRC
- 3. Set up a personal interview with CUCRC program staff (in person or via digital platform)
- 4. Students that qualify to live in CORE Housing then proceed with placement through CU Housing Services



CORE Housing is a residential community of students in recovery and living a sober lifestyle. Eight 2-bedroom apartments in two brick residence are available for sober undergraduate and graduate students who are interested in living and learning together in a sobriety-friendly community. Students must first apply to become a Core Member of the CU Collegiate Recovery Community and must remain an active member in order to live in Core Housing. Spaces are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. If full, students will be placed on a waitlist and may still participate in all programs and activities as Core Members then transfer into the Core Housing when space becomes available.
