Collegiate Recovery Community Campus Housing

The CORE Living program provides the opportunity for members of the CU Collegiate Recovery Community to live and learn together in a 4-plex apartment building along Boulder Creek on the north side of campus.

CORE Living is open to full-time freshman, transfer, upperclass and graduate students who:

- Have made personal commitment to living a substance-free lifestyle
- Have maintained continuous abstinence from all drugs and alcohol for a preferred minimum of six months
- Participate in a program or practices that support personal growth, health and well-being
- Are interested in being part of a sobriety- and recovery-focused community, sharing support with other students
- Commit to upholding the community values and guidelines



Students qualify for CORE Living by applying to become a Core Member or Ally Member of the CU Collegiate Recovery Community (CUCRC), which facilitates the CORE campus housing program. The CUCRC offers sober social activities, recovery meetings, professional staff and peer support. CORE Members are committed to having a community free from the influence and impact of alcohol and other drugs. They participate in community building through CORE Member programs and uphold community values and guidelines.

How to Apply

3. Set up a personal interview with CUCRC program directors (in person or via digital platform)
