



Research & Innovation Seed Grant

- \$50,000 each (approx. \$1 million available annually)
- Since 2006, more than \$12.5 million has been awarded to 302 faculty
- Purpose: stimulate new and exciting research, scholarship, and creative work
- Funding Priorities:
 - (a) interdisciplinary collaboration
 - (b) payoffs: future funding OR scholarly / artistic impact
- Sign up to review to position yourself for success

AB Nexus

- \$50K (new partnership) and \$125K (existing partnership) grants to expand collaboration between the CU Anschutz and CU Boulder campuses
- Identify areas of collaboration in biosciences, biochemistry, engineering, arts and sciences, pharmacology and immunology, public health, mental health and other areas
- Remove existing barriers in administrative processes and promote connectivity
- Drive innovation and research breakthroughs, pursue competitive awards
- Deadline: September 24



Shared Instrumentation Network Funding

- CU Boulder Core Facility Assistance Grant Program (CFAG)
 - ✓ Improve operations, safety, visibility and increase remote accessibility of cores.
 - ✓ Acquire, repair and upgrade instrumentation.

Deadline: mid-March

Core Facility Voucher Program

- ✓ Assists faculty in gathering new or additional data for grant applications (new and enhanced resubmissions)
- ✓ For addressing concerns from peer reviewers on a submitted manuscript for publication

Rolling Deadline



RIO Faculty Conference Awards

- Partial support for organizing inperson and virtual conferences that promote and encourage the research, scholarship, and creative work of CU Boulder faculty
- Rolling deadline, One-time or initial events (not established and/or annual events)
- Eligibility:
 - Faculty holding at least one-half time, tenured, or tenure track appointment.
 - Rostered instructors on continuing funds may apply.
- Basis of Awards:
 - Benefits of the conference to CU Boulder campus, faculty, and external research community
 - Research and creative record of participants

- Up to \$3,000; unit-level matching support expected
- Allowable Expenses:
 - Honorarium and/or travel and expenses for participants
 - Space and equipment rental
 - Publicity and/or reception expenses
 - Technical/special and student assistance
 - Organizational expenses
 - Costs associated with Virtual Conferences
- RIO encourages proposals for conferences that are interdisciplinary or promote new activities and new research connections between CU Boulder faculty and outside research and creative communities.

RIO Travel Grants

- Up to \$1500 to visit extramural sponsors
 - Government
 - Foundation
 - Industry
 - Not scholarly or scientific meetings
- Goal: Facilitate relationships between CU Boulder faculty and funders
- Eligibility:
 - Full time research faculty at CU Boulder (tenure-track professorial rank, research or clinical professorial rank)
 - Full time staff engaged as PIs on scholarly and scientific research (e.g., curators, librarians)
- No limit on number of trips supported
 - Priority given to those who have not received travel support in past 12 months.
- Applications accepted on rolling basis.

RIO Advocacy Grants

- Up to \$1000 for registration and travel for advocacy events such as National Humanities Advocacy, COSSA Social Science, Coalition of NSF, etc.
 - Airfare
 - Lodging (2 nights maximum)
 - Ground Transportation
- Goal: Facilitate relationships between CU Boulder faculty and legislators, policy experts and sponsors
- Eligibility:
 - Full time research faculty at CU Boulder (tenure-track professorial rank, research or clinical professorial rank)
 - Full time staff engaged as Pls on scholarly and scientific research (e.g., curators, librarians)
- No limit on number of trips supported
 - Priority given to those who have not received advocacy support in past 12 months.
- Applications accepted on rolling basis.

<u>Limited Submission Funding Opportunities</u>

- Required when a funder limits the number of applications that can be submitted by CU Boulder.
- Goal: Identify strongest project(s) with highest likelihood of securing funding.
- Procedures on RIO webpage
- Process:
 - Publicize active opportunity through RIO Bulletin (<u>subscribe here!</u>) & on <u>RIO</u> webpage
 - Internal application process (abbreviated version of sponsor application)
 - Review process (CU Boulder faculty, previous sponsor winners, etc.)
 - Notification to applicants (reviewer comments provided)
 - Requirements for internal winners (submit through OCG / Advancement; costshare; alert RIO of outcome; provide sponsor feedback to RIO)



- SBIR/STTR (Center for Translational Research): market research, industry analysis and strategy for teams seeking to translate inventions into startup enterprises.
