CONTINUING EDUCATION – ONLINE COMPOSITION HUB

A free tutoring service for students enrolled in Continuing Education evening and online credit courses, the [Online Composition Hub](http://composition.colorado.edu) (<http://composition.colorado.edu>) uses online tools to help students access experienced, peer tutors who provide guidance and review student work.

Tutors specialize in helping students with traditional papers, but they can assist with web design, video, blogging, Prezi, PowerPoint, and other projects as well. Professional materials, such as resumes, cover letters, applications, and research projects are also acceptable.

Tutors and students share assignments via Google Docs. Students have the option of communicating with tutors synchronously — online at the same time as a tutor and talking via chat, Skype, or Google Hangout — or asynchronously — tutors provide feedback within 24 hours of the appointment time.

ECOLOGY & EVOLUTIONARY BIOLOGY

EBIO Help Room: Undergraduate TAs are available to help students taking EBIO 1210 and/or 1230 in the fall and students taking EBIO 1220 and/or 1240 in the spring. The help room is located in Ramaley N197 (hours are listed on the door). They also provide an EBIO Writing Lab designed to help students with EBIO written work:

ECONOMICS

During the Fall and Spring semesters, the Department of Economics provides a free drop-in tutorial lab and a 'tutor list' for undergraduates enrolled in Economics courses. The drop-in lab is held in Econ 12A with a new schedule published each semester. The tutors are economics PhDs and advanced undergraduates. They are available to help with ECON 1078, 1088, 2010, 2020, 3070, 3080, 3818, econometrics and upper division economics electives. ENGINEERING AND APPLIED SCIENCE

GEOLOGICAL SCIENCES

GERMANIC AND SLAVIC LANGUAGES

INTEGRATED PHYSIOLOGY

The IPHY tutoring program is an entirely volunteer run-tutoring program: run by students for students. Our services are available to anyone who is taking an IPHY class. You have to be an IPHY major if you want help for any other non-IPHY classes that are required for the IPHY major (CHEM, PHYS, etc.). To ensure that every student gets access to our free tutors, a student is only able to request a tutor for one class. INTERNATIONAL ENGLISH CENTER (IEC)
