Purpose of the Course

The purpose of this course is to provide a comprehensive introduction to the ethical issues involved in conducting research. Many granting agencies, such as NIH, have this course as a requirement for trainees participating in research they fund.

Approach

The class will be taught primarily through reading, lectures, and discussion groups. Each day, the class will begin with a lecture on a specific research issue, and small group discussions on the topic or some other related activity will follow this. ALL classes will be recorded.

Grades

This class can be taken Pass/Fail or for a letter grade. This class will not count towards a degree if you take the Pass/Fail method. If

you take Pass/Fail method, you must pass this class to fulfill your NIH or NSF requirements.

If you take the graded method, you must get a 70% or better for this class to fulfill your NIH or NSF requirements.

• Quizzes

- Each week there will be a short quiz via Canvas before that week's class. This quiz will cover the reading and video material.

• Activities

- Each week there will be a short (generally 10 minutes, max 30 minutes) activity related to the homework material. This activity should be done after you have done the reading/videos for the week.

• Discussions

- Each class will have a lecture and a small group discussion.
 - Classroom small group discussion rules:
 - Respect your small group members. Everyone talks, and everyone is equal.
 - Don't point fingers or name names. This is not a complaint session.
 - Do call out improper conduct when you see it. Gentle peer correction may work better than reporting to a superior.
 - Grading: During or after class (within 24 hours), you must submit 3 sentences to your Canvas small group discussion to prove you were present. You will submit 1) were you in person or on Zoom 2) a one-sentence summary of the discussion, and 3) a comment you made in the live discussion. Your small group is responsible for watching for falsification statements.
 - I don't grade you on the content of your comments. I only grade based on the fact that you have made comments.
 - **Extra credit**
 - Be the designated Zoomer for your discussion group.
 - Claim this intention in the discussion group before class and bring a device to zoom the other people in the discussion group.
 - The Room Zoomer is a person in the live classroom who opens up Zoom on their device and ensures everyone on Zoom gets a chance to speak.

• Interview case study Essays

- During the semester, you will turn in two half-page **Interview case study essays**. Each will be about a separate stories.
- First, you will interview another researcher about one of the topics we cover in this course.
 - Ask them to tell you a story from their past that illustrates why this topic is essential to understand. For example, you could ask someone if they have ever suspected misconduct. Or you could ask them if they have ever disagreed about authorship on a paper. You could ask them if they have ever personally seen animal or human mistreatment in a research project.
- Second, write a half-page story about what happened to the person you interviewed. **This story should include no personal details.**

 - The story does not have to have a happy ending! A lot of responsible conduct of research case studies are grey. **Case study essays in which we don't know who was right or wrong are great!**
- The case studies will be submitted via Canvas.

- Make-ups are not easy on purpose. We prefer you attend every class.
- Quizzes:
 - There will be a 10% penalty for each week the quiz is late. The “week” begins as class begins.
- Activity:
 - There will be a 10% penalty for each week the weekly activity is late. The “week” begins as class begins.


