7 Tips for Volunteering During the Holidays!

- **1. Plan ahead.** Holiday volunteer opportunities fill up fast. If you want your perfect volunteer opportunity, start organizing today.
- **2. Make a calendar of giving.** Choose one service project per month or week from the ideas listed in the holiday guide.
- **3. Consider your needs and interests** and make sure that they align with the volunteer opportunity.
- **4. Be open to trying something new**. Trying something new and challenging might just be good for you! We recommend stepping out of your comfort zone to volunteer at an animal shelter, wear an elf's outfit to hand out toys, or spend time with seniors.
- **5. Don't flake**. When you commit to a volunteer opportunity, follow through with it. If you do need to cancel, give the coordinators as much notice as possible. Organizations need help and they will have to replace you.
- **6. Don't get discouraged!** If the volunteer opportunity you want is full, consider volunteering after the holidays. Start a new tradition and make volunteering a New Year's Resolution.
- **7. Keep the giving going.** Volunteer on a regular basis rather than just seasonally. Organizations need contributions throughout the year, such as donating blood or disaster recovery. If you have a skill that people typically pay you to perform—like playing piano or tuning up bikes—consider donating that service to an organization that might need your help.
