
Caitlin Nicole Johnston









Oliver is graduating with a Bachelor's degree in Cinema Studies and a Minor in Theater, and hopes to pursue a career in Sound Technology.






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Jack is graduating with a BA in Creative Writing and a BA in Theatre, with hopes to work as a special effects makeup artist.


Belinda Polynice
