• Director's Note •

"... this sequestered glen has long been known by the name of Sleepy Hollow. ... [T]he place still continues under the sway of some witching power that holds a spell over ... the descendants of the original settlers. They are given to all kinds of marvelous beliefs, are subject to trances and visions, and frequently hear music and voices in the air. The ... neighborhood abounds with tales, haunted spots, and twilight superstitions.

"The dominant spirit that haunts this enchanted region is the apparition of a figure on horseback without a head. It is said to be the ghost of a Hessian trooper, whose head had been carried away by a cannonball in ... the Revolutionary War, and who is ever seen ... hurrying along in the gloom of the night. ... [T]he ghost rides forth to the scene of battle in nightly quest of his head; and ... the rushing speed with which he sometimes passes along the Hollow is owing to his being in a hurry to get back to the churchyard before daybreak. The specter is known ... by the name of the Headless Horseman of Sleepy Hollow."
