MFA in Dance

Kristen Holleyman graduated from The University of Colorado, Boulder with a B.A. in Spanish Literature, Secondary Education, and a Minor in Dance. During her performance career in Los Angeles, she created with artists Daft Punk and Mya, movement collectives The Iris Company, Intersect Dance Theatre, Heidi Duckler Dance Theatre, and with filmmakers Floria Sigismondi, Justin Gum, and Obba Babatundé. As the founder of Embodied Arts (co)LAB, Kristen's choreographic works have been presented at festivals in Mexico, the United States, and Portugal. She has been teaching dance for 14 years to local, international and bilingual communities, at-risk youth, and children with disabilities, and taught Spanish at Kallpachay Spanish Immersion Program in Los Angeles. Returning to her roots at CU in the Dance/Choreography M.F.A. program, she studied multimedia performance with a secondary emphasis in somatics as a Gyrokinesis ® apprentice. During her graduate experience, she has been teaching technique courses such as Beginning Ballet with Experience, Beginning Contemporary, Intermediate Advanced Contemporary, and a T.A. for Dancing Histories. She was awarded the Program Fee Grant, Charlotte York Irey Scholarship, University of Colorado Graduate Travel Grant, and Eaton Travel Grant, making it possible to present her choreographic work "5" at Quinzena de Danca Almada International Dance Festival in Portugal in Fall, 2019. In the community, she has been teaching at local schools and studios, and is a principal performer for Chadash Contemporary Dance Movement. Her thesis concert, A Onda (The Wave in Portuguese), was a multimedia, site specific, contemporary performance, a bricolage exploring consciousness, interconnectivity, U.S. and Mesoamerican women's spirituality, and ecofeminism through the lense of starfish anatomy and movement. As a practitioner of floorwork, contemporary forms, Gaga, improvisation, Hip Hop, and single-point trapeze (a newer student), she integrates these movement forms through research in starfish movement modalities, Spirit-based sacred movement practice, nature/water-immersive movement research, and multilingualism (Spanish, Portuguese); she is interested in how interactive film/projection collaborates with these experiences. She is dedicated to an embodied practice that cultivates freedom and sanctuary of the body/mind/spirit through feminist and somatic pedagogy, radical care in empathy, healing, and her own reclamation as a female movement artist. Today she graduates as a Master of Fine Arts in Dance, and extends her gratitude to all of her teachers, mentors, fellow grads, and family who have made this experience rich, lifechanging, and unforgettable.

Sen's performance practice, scholarship, and teaching lie in the postcolonial studies and theatre of South Asian diaspora, theatre and social change, digital humanities, and communitybased performance practices. Sen's dissertation, "Conscience on Stage: Revising Jatra in Bengal as a Tool for Representation, Restoration, and Revolution," investigates the traditional theatre form Jatra from West Bengal, India and its contribution to asserting a communal and participatory performance space. By examining the character type that depicts the anthropomorphizing of the "conscience," commonly known as the bibek within Jatra, Sen examines the nature of contemporary Jatra through the bibek character. As part of the CU Boulder Department of Theatre and Dance 2019-2020 season, Sen has adapted and directed the play Shakuntala by Kalidasa and received an award for directing from the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival for this show. Sen's research and reviews have appeared in Ecumenica Journal, Journal of Dramatic Theory and Criticism, Asian Theatre Journal, and New England Theatre Journal. Sen is the recipient of 2019-2020 Graduate Student Teaching Excellence Award through the Graduate School at the University of Colorado Boulder.
