- Investigating the addition of a masters of music therapy degree (Tennessee has three undergraduate programs, no graduate programs);
- Began Artist/Lecturer-in-Residency Program in 2015. Artists: Cavani Quartet (2019), Jim Self (2018), Jennifer Higdon (2017), Anne Azema (2016), Ellen Reid 2019 Pulitzer Prize Winner (2015)
- Completing a proposal with the Office of Research and Engagement to have our art's representative have office hours in our building to allow faculty direct access to discuss their research and scholarly creative activities, particularly directed at internal and external funding sources;
- Renegotiating the return of UT Concert Hall with WUOT (Knoxville's National Public Radio Station);

 and degrees in the ever-evolving job market;

This data was used to bring consistency to loads for tenure and tenure-track faculty academic, conducting and applied faculty. It was shared with the faculty who approved it;
